FROM THE PASTOR

THE LORD IS A GOD OF JUSTICE

The first reading for this Sunday begins, "The Lord is a God of justice, who knows no favorites. Though not unduly partial toward the weak, yet he hears the cry of the oppressed." In our Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 34) we hear, "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." And in our Gospel, Jesus says of the tax collector who confessed his sins and asked for mercy, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." When God looks at someone, He recognizes not only those who are materially poor, but also those who are spiritually poor. Remember the first of The Beatitudes, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for the Kingdom of God is theirs."

The Lord is a God of justice. For many today, justice is a bad word. Their argument, whether they recognize it or not, is with God. If God is God of justice, then you and I must be people of justice ourselves. As God hears the cry of the poor, so must we. We may be very limited in how we can respond to the cry of the poor, but we must listen and hear their cry, and we must CARE. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus makes it clear that the question is not, "Who is my neighbor?" but, "To whom am I neighbor?"

As always, whenever we try to limit Christ's call for us to love and care, He is having none of that. There are no limits. There are no boundaries.

ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS DAYS

November is the final month of the Church year. As such, the Church turns its reflections to the so-called Last Things – Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell.

This Saturday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints, when we honor all of those who have been officially declared to be saints, and those anonymous saints, who have run the race, and now wear the crown of victory. They reveal to us the glory that we will experience when we are with them in the Kingdom of God.

Sunday, November 2, is the Feast of All Souls, when we pray for all who have died, especially those who have not yet completed their final period of purification and have not yet entered into the perfect happiness of being face to face with God in heaven. Those we have traditionally called the Poor Souls, have died, forgiven for their sins, but whose souls have not been purified of attachment to sin. That final purification, which we call Purgatory, is a state of spiritual healing, when they are set free from all attachment to sin.

The Mass on Saturday at 12:05 pm will be for the Solemnity of All Saints. Because the Solemnity falls on a Saturday, it is celebrated as a Holy Day, but the obligation to attend Mass is dropped.

The Masses on Sunday, November 2, will be for the Feast of All Souls.

OKTOBERFEST

Our Annual Oktoberfest is one of the highlights of our year here at Mother of God Church. Our parish was founded by German immigrants, with German-speaking people making up the congregation, with German-speaking priests serving the people, and German-speaking nuns running our school, teaching German-speaking kids, in German. This went on up until World War I, when the American bishops asked all German-speaking parishes to stop doing so, because the German Americans were being looked at with suspicion and with concern that they were loyal to Germany rather than America.

We honor our German roots (even I, your Irish pastor, am one-eighth German), with this annual celebration. Even if you are not German, all are invited to join us this afternoon after the 11:30 am Mass for good German food and music and fellowship.

SAINTS SIMON AND JUDE, APOSTLES

This Tuesday, October 28, is the Feast of Saints Simon and Jude. The Scriptures give us very little information about Saints Simon and Jude, though Church tradition gives us much to reflect upon.

Simon is not Simon Peter, but is Simon the Zealot. The Zealots were a Fourth Philosophy within Judaism. The first three were the Pharisees, the Sadducees, and the Essenes. The Zealots were not a religious movement within the Jewish people, but were a violent political group whose goal was to drive the Romans from their homeland. They did this by assassinations and guerilla activity.

At some point, Simon, who was a member of this group, encountered Jesus. We are not told when or where or how this encounter took place, but he became a member of Jesus' company of apostles, renouncing the violence that he embraced as a Zealot. He is often identified as Simon the Zealot, to distinguish him from Simon Peter. There are many conflicting traditions about when and where and how Simon died. Some traditions state that Saints Simon and Jude served together as a missionary duo.

Saint Jude shared his name with Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus. Because the name Judas had become so toxic in early Christian life, he became known as Saint Jude. There are a few different Judes listed in the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. There is also the Epistle of Saint Jude. There have been strong disagreements among scholars about who each of these Judes might be, and if there is more than one Jude involved here.

In Matthew and Mark, the name of Jude is not included in the list of The Apostles, but they include the name Thaddeus, not listed in the other Gospels. Most scholars believe that Jude and Thaddeus are the same person. Most Jews of that time had a Jewish name and a Greek name. Christian tradition tells us the Jude was the son of Clopas and Mary of Clopas, who was the sister of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Tradition tells us that Jude was martyred either in Beirut or Armenia.

After his death, pilgrims would travel to the site of Jude's burial and experienced the powerful intercession of the saint. Because of this, he became known as "The Saint for the Hopeless and Despaired." Saint Bridget of Sweden and Saint Bernard both had visions from God declaring Jude to be the Saint of the Impossible. He is mostly known as the Saint of Hopeless Causes.

Young Adults – Plan to Attend World Youth Day in Seoul, South Korea – July 30 to August 10, 2027!

The Diocese of Covington is coordinating a pilgrimage to World Youth Day 2027 in Seoul, South Korea, for young adults ages 18 to 35.
