

FROM THE PASTOR

RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

The Church in the United States celebrates October as Respect Life Month, and it celebrates this first Sunday of October as Respect Life Sunday. Unfortunately, since Roe v Wade was overturned, the Pro-Life Movement seems to have lost some of its enthusiasm. The struggle for the unborn has shifted from a national campaign to a state campaign. And we have not been terribly successful in that battle. Even in Kentucky, which has been a relatively Pro-Life state, the amendment to end abortion was defeated.

What can we do? We can pray. Pray for men and women who are facing unplanned or difficult or unwanted pregnancies. Pray that they will seek and receive the support and encouragement that they need in order to choose life for their children, that they will find the inner strength and grace to say Yes to God and to the life of their children.

Support various Pro-Life organizations that provide the support and help that is needed.

Talk about the lives of the unborn to your children and grandchildren. They are receiving the pro-death message from all sides of the culture, and there needs to be a correction. Let young people know that you will obviously be disappointed and hurt if they have a pregnancy outside of marriage, but that you will stand with them as they say Yes to life.

INCREASE OUR FAITH

In today's Gospel, The Apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. His response was, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could tell this mulberry tree to uproot itself and cast itself into the sea, and it would do so." This response would have been doubly troubling to them.

First of all, "Jesus, we asked to you increase our faith, we didn't say that we didn't have any. Certainly, we have faith the size of a mustard seed. You don't have to insult us." And secondly, no one in history has ever had the power to say to a mulberry tree, "Uproot yourself and cast yourself into the sea, and it would obey. What you are saying makes no sense to us. How could that happen?"

Jesus is telling them (us) that they have more than enough faith, but they have to try it. They need to step out in faith, and they will see its power. We want faith that will make our lives not be scary. But they are scary, and we need to trust God, and act in faith. We will be shocked by the results.

As to uprooting mulberry seeds and even mountains, that will take some practice. We start small and grow into greater things.

PRIEST RETREAT

The priests of the Diocese of Covington will be on their Annual Retreat at Saint Meinrad Benedictine Monastery from this Monday until Friday. This is an event that we all look forward to each year, as it is the only time that we get to spend real quality time with one another, catching up with each other and praying together. Please keep us in your prayers and know that you will be in mine.

There will be daily Masses at the Cathedral at 8:00 am each day.

OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

Tuesday, October 7, is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Church calls all of us to pray the Rosary regularly, daily if possible. Taking time to pray the Rosary gives us fifteen to twenty minutes to spend with Jesus and Mary.

The Rosary is a meditation device that helps us to imagine the Mystery of the Rosary being prayed, For instance, when you come to the First Joyful Mystery, take a few moments before you start saying the prayers, to picture Mary in her home in Nazareth, as the Angel Gabriel appears to her. Perhaps focus on Mary's Fiat, when she says, "Let it be done to me according to your word." Is the Lord asking something of you, and have you said yes to his request? Bring the image into your life, or that of someone else in your life.

I always offer a particular petition for each Mystery as well. I usually pray one Mystery for my family, one for the people of Mother of God, one for Bishop Iffert and the priests of our Diocese, and one or two for various local or national or international situations.

Pope Saint John XXIII

Saturday, October 11, is the Feast of Pope Saint John XXIII. Many of us still have memories of Saint John, as he was the Vicar of Christ from 1958 to 1963. He was seen as a grandfather figure, known as Good Pope John, full of love and kindness. He is also known as the Pope who called forth the Second Vatican Council. The Council was carried out in four sessions, over four years. Pope John XXIII died after the first session of the Council and was followed by Pope Paul VI.


