FROM THE PASTOR

ALL THINGS MUST PASS

Many of us, at least the adults, remember September 11, 2001. We watched the unfolding of a great tragedy in our country, and as is often stated, everything changed. We saw the Twin Towers collapse, killing thousands, including many fire fighters and police officers. I imagine people standing beneath the Towers on September 10, looking up and admiring its height and power. And I imagine someone standing there, saying, "By this time tomorrow both of these towers will be nothing more than rubble." And those who hear him think he is insane – this is an impossibility to them.

Jesus and the Apostles were in Jerusalem, looking up at the Temple, which was the most remarkable structure they had ever seen. They saw the giant stones and all that was going on. The crowd was mesmerized by the Temple. And Jesus said, "All these things you see here, a day will come when there will not be one stone on top of another." His listeners would have been shocked by these words and would not have believed such a thing could happen. But just as the Twin Towers were destroyed, so was the Temple.

We may remember George Harrison's solo album, All Things Must Pass. Drawing from Eastern religious instruction, he is telling us the same thing as Jesus. Look around Mother of God Church. It is one of the most beautiful churches in America. Over one hundred and fifty years old, it is still incredibly strong, for it was well built, and well cared for (thank you, Vic). And yet, a day will come when it will not be standing. Destroyed by earthquake, or storm, or age, or any other cause that we cannot even imagine, it will be gone. The United States at some point will be gone, or radically diminished. And we will be gone.

All things must pass.

A JOURNEY WITH SAINT PETER

I have begun a new series of talks, made up of four weeks of reflections on Saint Peter. We are touching on a number of scenes about Peter in the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. Peter is the most human and most relatable of all of the characters in the New Testament, and the events of his life give us an opportunity to reflect on our own lives and our own relationship with Christ.

This week, we will look at Peter's Confession of Faith, Jesus' Declaration of Peter as the leader of the Church and the giving of the Keys to the Kingdom, Jesus' Prediction of the Passion, and Peters rebuke ("Get behind me Satan, you are trying to make me trip and fall.")

We will meet at 10:30 am and at 6:30 pm in church.

THE CHURCH'S LITURGICAL YEAR

On November 30, the Church begins a new Church year with the First Sunday of Advent. The Liturgical Year is made up of four special seasons, and what is called Ordinary Time. The special seasons are: 1) Advent 2) Christmas, 3) Lent and 4) Easter. Most of the year is Ordinary Time, which is about 33 Sundays when we will be reading from the Gospel of Matthew.

The purpose of a regular calendar is to mark time in general. The Liturgical Calendar is a meditation on the life and ministry of Jesus. The Church uses a three-year calendar, based on the three so called Synoptic Gospels. The Synoptic Gospels are Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Mark was the first Gospel written, and Matthew and Luke had a copy of Mark in front of them as they wrote their own Gospels. It seems that they also had another document that scholars call "Q" or Quelle (German for Source), that contained many quotes from Jesus, that are not included in Mark. Each of them seem also to have another source of their own

If you are present for the three years of Sunday readings, you will hear 89.9 percent of the Gospels, 54.0 percent of the non-Gospel New Testament readings (Acts, Epistles, Book of Revelation), which comes to 71.5 percent of the New Testament. There is also 13.5 percent of the Old Testament, not including the Psalms.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Scripture does not tell us of the Presentation of Mary, but early non-Biblical writings do give us the story. When Mary was still a young girl (stories differ at what age), Joachim and Anne, her mother and father, brought her to the Temple, and she was presented to the High Priest, consecrating her life to God. One of the windows on the Eastern side of Mother of God Church shows her going up the steps of the Temple to the High Priest. Her parents are there with her.

Mary, of course, lived out this consecration throughout her life, symbolized by her words at the Annunciation, "Let it be done to me according to your word." Her Presentation also pre-figures our baptisms, when we, too, were consecrated to Christ.

The Feast of the Presentation of Mary is on Friday, November 21.

SAINT CECILIA

Saint Cecilia was a young woman who lived in Rome during the 2nd Century. She is considered the patron saint of music and of musicians. She was martyred during one of the early persecutions of the Church. We have a window of Saint Cecilia, playing the organ (even though the organ was not invented until long after her death). The problem is that it is in my bedroom, so it is not visible to anyone except for me and my facility manager, and the person who cleans the rectory.

Saturday, November 22, is the Feast of Saint Cecilia.


