FROM THE PASTOR

THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

The Solemnity of Christ the King is the final Sunday of the Church year, and it celebrates the final victory of Christ over His enemies (sin and death) and the ultimate victory of the Kingdom of God. All evil will be defeated, and all people will live according to the will of God.

Even though, through His Resurrection, Jesus has already won the war, and we know that the forces of evil will not win in the end, they are still, obviously, present and are capable of bringing about a great deal of chaos and suffering.

At present, the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of Darkness both still exist. We must each decide which Kingdom we will be faithful to.

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR GAZA

Two weeks ago, the Bishops of the United States met in Baltimore for their annual fall gathering. They discussed a number of issues at that meeting. One decision that they made was that a nationwide special collection should be taken up for the people of Gaza who have suffered so terribly in the war between Israel and Hamas. That collection is this weekend. Please be generous.

THANKSGIVING

Thursday of this week is Thanksgiving, the closest day that our nation has to a Holy Day. The earliest Thanksgiving Day in America was in 1631, when Pilgrims who had come to the New Country and the Native Americans who supported and helped them through the harsh winter, and then had a banner year of crops and hunting, gathered together to celebrate their great harvest, and the fact that they had survived a year in this beautiful and harsh land.

Sadly, this great peace and sharing of Native Americans and Pilgrims would only last for one year. A great war for America would take place over the next 300 + years, up until today.

In 1863, President Lincoln would declare Thanksgiving to be a National Holiday. How strange that it was during the most distressing time in our nation's history, the Civil War, that a holiday dedicated to counting our national and personal blessings was established.

An interesting, but totally irrelevant, Thanksgiving fact, took place in 1953. The Swanson Company dramatically overestimated how much turkey they could sell and ended up with 260 tons of extra turkey. They decided to put together what people could buy, including turkey, dressing, gravy, sweet potatoes and peas. They sold ten million of these the first year, beginning the frozen dinner industry.

ADVENT BEGINS

Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent, which begins the new Church year. Advent is four weeks, leading up to Christmas, in which we put ourselves into the position of the Hebrew people, who waited, and planned, and prayed for the coming of the Messiah. We also put ourselves into a sense of waiting and planning and praying for the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time.

The spiritual meaning of this season is – WAIT. Waiting is not something that most of us are really good at. Ours is an instant-gratification culture. We want everything now. Can you imagine waiting for over a thousand years for the fulfillment of the promises made by God to an ancient patriarch, Abraham, and to Moses? One of the prayers in the Psalms that we hear over and over is, "How long, O Lord, how long?" And yet some (not all) waited and kept faith with God throughout Israel's history.

When will Christ return? We do not know, but we wait with expectation, and we prepare ourselves for whenever He does return.

BLESSED MIGUEL AGUSTIN PRO

In the early years of the Twentieth Century, there was a very anti-Catholic revolution in Mexico. This was followed by a very anti-Catholic constitution. Priests were forbidden to wear clerical dress. Other restrictions were put on Catholics and Catholic institutions as well. There was a Mexican priest, Father Miguel Agustin Pro, who was ordained in Europe, and when he returned to Mexico, had to minister in a Church that had gone underground.

A Catholic revolution, known as the Cristeros (Christian) Rebellion, took place, and there was a war between them and the Mexican government. The President of Mexico was assassinated, and those opposing the Catholics used that as an opportunity to go after Miguel Pro, even though he had no connection to the rebellion. Without a trial, Miguel was executed.

Before he was executed by firing squad, Miguel Pro raised his arms, in imitation of Christ, and cried out, "Viva Christo Rey", which means "Long Live Christ the King." As he was carried to his grave 40,000 people lined the streets, and another 20,000 were at his grave site, awaiting the arrival of his body.

In 1988, Pope John Paul II beatified Miguel Agustin Pro. This is why he is called "Blessed." The process for his eventual canonization as a saint continues.

The feast day for Blessed Pro is on November 23. That is today, which is the Solemnity of Christ the King, so that takes precedence over Miguel Pro's feast day. How interesting that we celebrate Miguel Pro's feast day on Christ the King, when his final words were, "Long Live Christ the King."



Dear Friends,

In today's bulletin, you will find our annual financial report, which provides a look at our year-end statements from the past three years. In addition to the numbers, I want to provide some context to help you understand how our parish is doing financially.

We budget with the goal that everything we receive via your offertory gift matches our expenses dollar for dollar. Our projections for the coming year are conservative, based on trending data, such as past giving, new parishioner registrations, cost of living increases, anticipated expenses, etc. Once the new budget is prepared, it is then reviewed and approved by Finance Council and Parish Pastoral Council.

FY25 Highlights

- We are in good financial standing, with no outstanding debts or liabilities.
- Revenue from our parking lot rentals continues to cover the cost of lot upkeep, landscaping and snow removal on our grounds.
- Our Sunday and Holy Day collections for FY25 totaled \$657,000, exceeding our budget by 7.5%.
- This surplus was offset, however, by some unexpected expenses, which included:
 - Storm damage and repairs to our apartment buildings across the street, which resulted in a loss of rental income for four months
 - A water leak in the rectory
 - o Organ repair
- All expenses against our Sunday and Holy Day collections alone would have resulted in a \$140,000 loss for FY25. However, we were able to cover much of the cost with our DPAA rebate, which is not included in our operating budget.
- Facility issues did not stop us from giving to our community. Our parish supported Catholic education providing approximately \$168,000 to ACUE and high school support as required.
 We also contributed to outside charitable agencies.

Looking Ahead

Overall, I am pleased with where we are.

In the FY26 budget, we have included the costs of the front plaza reconstruction and the repair of our sound system speakers, which are significant. We have done our best to identify other potential expenses, which include much-needed upgrades to our security cameras.

In addition, we are blessed to have the Memorial Fund, which has provided us with significant returns over time that defray repairs to our church and rectory. This fund was established exclusively for maintenance of these two structures and is not part of our operating budget. In FY25, parishioners donated more than \$17,514 to the fund, while bequests totaled \$89,427. Stocks did very well, which increased the balance.

As we consider the future, we recognize that the neighborhood around Mother of God is changing dramatically. Thanks to the development happening in Covington, more people are moving to the urban core, and we are looking at ways to effectively share the Good News with our neighbors and invite them to see what we have to offer.

Our efforts are paying off. Since January 2025, we have registered more than 63 new members. (In 2024, we welcomed more than 100 new parishioners.) Many of you attended our ministry fair in February, looking for ways to be actively engaged, and this year's OCIA class is one of our largest ever.

Your interest and involvement in the parish are critical to shaping a bright future for Mother of God. I am grateful for your generosity in donating your time, talent and treasure, and I am excited about what we can accomplish together.
