## FROM THE PASTOR

#### GAUDETE SUNDAY

This Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, which translates as Rejoice Sunday. We rejoice because Advent is coming to its close, and Christmas, the celebration is near. This sense of rejoicing was more intense when Advent was forty days in length, and included fasting from meat for the full time, and other penitential practices were common. Advent is far less painful now, so it does not have the impact that it once did.

But spiritually, it is important for us to hear the message of Rejoice Sunday. We rejoice because God has won salvation for us through the birth, life, Passion and Resurrection of His Son, Jesus. We rejoice because we know that He will return again in power and glory and will bring forth the Kingdom in its fullness. We rejoice because God is with us throughout our lives, and that we know ourselves as sons and daughters of God.

The one sign that we might possess that shows that we are Christian is joy. Even in times of struggle, we can rejoice. In his Epistle to the Romans, Saint Paul lists many obstacles and problems and sufferings that may come our way. He then says, "In all these things, we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us."

I think that the greatest tool for evangelizing others is our joy. If you are concerned about your kids, or other family, or friends, or whomever, who do not have a relationship with God or with the Church, it will be your joy that will most attract them to return to a life of faith. If the world sees a joy in Christians, many will say to themselves, "I want what they have."

Rejoice in the Lord always! Again, I say, rejoice!

#### **INVITE SOMEONE TO CHRISTMAS MASS**

Christmas is eleven days away. Please take some time to think about inviting someone who does not regularly attend Mass, or who has no particular church that they belong to, to attend Christmas Mass with you. The primary reason that non-churchgoers give for not going to church, is that no one ever asked them. That is a tragedy.

Pray about this, and when you have decided who you want to ask to come to Mass with you, spend time praying for them, and asking God to show you when and how to invite them. The Cursillo movement has a saying: Talk to God about your friend before you talk to your friend about God. There is great wisdom in that.

There is not a lot of time left. Let's get to work.

#### UPDATE ON REPAIRS FROM LIGHTNING STRIKE

As you know, a few weeks ago, Mother of God Church experienced a massive lightning strike. People from all over town heard the explosion. Virtually all of our electronic systems were knocked out. Our Wi-Fi, internet, sound system, live streaming system, etc. were knocked out. Most of that has been slowly but surely restored.

Unfortunately, our sound system is a different matter. The entire system was burnt up by the strike, and will have to be replaced, including those repairs that we just put in this summer. We are renting a temporary system for use in church, and it will get us through the time necessary for installing a new system.

We have received estimates for the work done, and our insurance company has agreed that this work needs to be done. Now, what we need is approval from the Diocese to allow us to sign contracts and to begin the work. When we have that approval, and sign the contract, it will require a few weeks for the company to order and receive all of the materials that will be needed. Then, once they begin work, it should take a couple of weeks to actually install the system.

Keep praying for us that we will accomplish our repairs and installations effectively and quickly. I will try to keep you informed as we move forward.

#### FINAL SESSION OF TALKS ON PETER

This Thursday, I will complete my four-part series of talks on Saint Peter. I plan to do another series during Lent, but do not yet know what I will be covering.

Please keep me in your prayers as I discern where the Lord wants me to go.

#### HANUKKAH

The Jewish Feast of Hanukkah begins tonight, December 14, and goes for eight days until Monday, December 22. It is one of the major celebrations for our Jewish brothers and sisters.

Judea was conquered by Alexander the Great. When he died, the many nations that he had conquered were divided up into three and distributed to three of his generals. Judea became part of the Seleucid Kingdom. Generations after Alexander, a particularly cruel emperor came to power, whose name was Antiochus IV. He forbid the practice of the Jewish faith, insisting that parents not circumcise their children, that they eat pork, and other practices that defiled the Jewish religion.

Most people went along with these practices to avoid torture and killing by the Greeks. One family, the Maccabees, refused, and formed a guerilla army to do battle with the Greeks. Eventually, against all odds, the Jewish people were successful at overthrowing the Greeks and driving them out.

The Jewish people restored the Temple, which had been shut down and had been desecrated. Then they prepared an eight-day celebration and reconsecration of the Temple. All went well, but they realized at the beginning of the eight days, that they only had enough oil to burn the menorah for one day. They lit the candle, and miraculously it continued to burn for the full eight days.

Since that time, the Jewish people celebrate Hanukkah with special foods, music, and the lighting of the eight stemmed menorah over the eight days of the festival.
