FROM THE PASTOR

PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

On this Second Sunday of Advent, the Church focuses its attention on John the Baptist, who is one of the great symbols of Advent. This season of preparing for the coming of Christ, it is he who proclaims the Advent message: "Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight His paths."

John's message comes before Jesus shows up on the stage of salvation history. He is speaking at a time when there was a great deal of corruption in the court of King Herod, and, sadly, in those who were the leaders of religion, especially those who were the leaders in the Temple. Because of this corruption among the leaders, the faith of the people had become somewhat lukewarm. John came to prophecy against the leaders and to stir up the faith of the people.

John prophesied, "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I.....He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." In the midst of John's ministry, Jesus Himself will arrive and undergo the baptism of John, a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. We ask, "If Jesus is sinless, whose sins is He confessing and repenting of?" He is confessing and repenting of our sins, as He will do again on the Cross.

Advent is a penitential season, in which we examine our consciences to recognize what in us is blocking our way to God, repent of our sins, and confess those sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is perhaps the most important way in which we prepare the way of the Lord.

THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Tomorrow, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. All feasts of Mary are really about Jesus, and this is certainly true in regard to the Immaculate Conception. God the Father gave special blessings to Mary, so that she might be a pure vessel for His son to enter into the world. The graces of salvation, won by the Death and Resurrection of her Son

Jesus, were given to Mary in advance of Jesus' birth, so that she would be free from all sin, personal and Original.

When we look at Mary, the Immaculate Conception, we see the Original Plan of God for all of us. He created Adam and Eve without Original Sin, but they chose to follow the serpent, and they, and we, fell from grace. So, she shows us who we were all intended to be.

Mary also shows us who we will be. In heaven, we will be purified of all sin, and we will be Immaculate ourselves. It is too late for us to be immaculately conceived, but we will be free of all sins when we are in the Kingdom.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have Mass at 12:05 pm and 6:30 pm.

RECOVERY FROM ELECTRIC STRIKE

On Tuesday, November 18, we had a serious lightning strike that severely impacted all of our electronics at Mother of God. Our sound system was knocked out, our streaming services were knocked out, we lost internet, and other electronic problems impacted us. We have slowly but surely been restoring all of these.

We still do not have our sound system working. I met with the sound people last Tuesday afternoon, and they will let us know more about what is going on, and what will be required to fix the system. I will keep you informed as we receive updates.

Thankfully, we have been able to rent a temporary sound system that is working for us. I do not know yet what will happen with our streaming system. I should learn more over the next few days. I will let you know what I have learned. Thank you for your patience.

SAINT JUAN DIEGO

Continuing our Blessed Mother theme for this week, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Juan Diego on Tuesday, December 9. I will write about Juan Diego in my next item on Our Lady of Guadalupe.

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

On December 9, 1532, just forty years after Columbus came to the Americas, a man named Juan Diego was walking past the Hill of Tepeyac, just outside of Mexico City. After Columbus arrived in the Americas, Franciscan missionaries from Spain came to the New Land, but had little success in winning converts. Juan Diego was one of their successes. As he walked by the hill, he saw a beautiful woman, who told him to go the local bishop, and tell him that he was to build a church there, dedicated to Mary.

Juan went to the bishop and delivered his message, but the bishop and his advisors were understandably skeptical. He told Juan that he was to tell the woman, if she was in fact the Mother of Jesus, that she should give him a sign so that he could know it was she, and that her request was legitimate. Juan told her this. The next day, as he walked by the hill, he saw her again, and she told him to gather the roses that were nearby. This was surprising, even though it was in a warm climate, roses do not grow in Mexico in winter.

He gathered the roses in his cactus fiber poncho, called a tilma, and carried them to the house of the bishop. Juan was admitted to the bishop's house, and as he was led into the office of the bishop, he let the tilma drop, and the roses fell to the floor. But what astounded the bishop and his priests was that there was an image on the tilma, of the beautiful woman who Juan had met.

The Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe was built. The cactus fiber tilma, with the image of Our Lady, still exists and hangs in the Basilica. It should have deteriorated within 25 or 30 years. Another miracle. The word about Mary's visit to Mexico spread and large numbers of converts were won for Christ. Within ten years, nine to ten million indigenous people became Catholic, the most successful missionary triumph in the history of the Church.

The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is this Friday, December 12.
