FROM THE PASTOR

Our Savior Parish

This Tuesday, July 15, I become the pastor of Our Savior Parish in Covington. Please pray for me as I take on those new responsibilities.

WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR?

We all know this line from Mister Rogers, sung as he introduced his children's show. It is an act of radical generosity and kindness to invite the world to be one's neighbor.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is asked by a lawyer, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus' response is the Two Great Commandments – "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself."

The lawyer, wishing to "justify" himself, then asked, "And who is my neighbor?" He wanted to make sure that he fulfilled the law, but did not want to have to go very far in order to fulfill the law. He wanted to set limits on the requirement to love neighbor.

Jesus did not answer the question, "Who is my neighbor?" but rather had the lawyer, and we, ask ourselves, "To whom am I neighbor?" To answer this more challenging question, Jesus told the story of the Good Samaritan.

The man who was beaten, robbed, and left for dead, was a Jew. Those who passed by him were also Jews. They feared that if he were dead, or if they got his blood on them, they would be considered unclean and would be barred from the synagogue or Temple services and could not enter their own homes or visit with their own families, until they were purified and made clean again. Those who should have seen the man in the ditch as their neighbor were making excuses why they had no responsibility here. The Samaritan, one of the most hated by the Jews, would not be considered the man's neighbor by anyone, including by the victim himself. If he had seen the Samaritan in his own situation, lying in the ditch, he would probably have had nothing to do with him himself.

But the Samaritan, this hated and avoided foreigner, had compassion. He not only poured water and oil on the man's wounds, but also lifted him up onto his own animal, and took him to a nearby town, and paid for the man to stay overnight in an inn.

The next day, seeing that the man could not travel, he paid the innkeeper to take care of the man, and said that when he returned he would pay whatever was owed.

Jesus then asked the punchline: "Which of these men was neighbor to the man who had been attacked?" Clearly the answer is that it was the hated and despised Samaritan.

There is a natural question that arises in our minds, as well as in those who passed by. Who is my neighbor? How far do I have to go in showing charity to others? Am I responsible for the sufferings of people I do not know? Who live in other countries? Who are my enemies?

Jesus' answer to these questions is pretty obvious. We do not set boundaries on our charity.

ACUE COLLECTION

ACUE stands for Alliance for Catholic Urban Education. A number of years ago, the Diocese of Covington created ACUE on behalf of the urban Catholic schools in Covington, Newport, Bellevue, Dayton and Taylor Mill. These include Prince of Peace, Saint Augustine, Holy Cross, Saint Anthony, and Holy Trinity schools.

ACUE oversees the running of these schools and is responsible for the financing of the schools. As part of this, the urban parishes are all asked to take up a special collection for the support of the ACUE schools.

Our collection for ACUE is this Sunday. Please be generous.

SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Kateri Tekakwitha was a young Mohawk woman who joined the Catholic Church at great cost to herself. She was rejected by many in her tribe, including many of her family. She was a woman of deep prayer, who took a vow of perpetual virginity, and moved into a Jesuit community in what is now upstate New York. Kateri became known as the Lily of the Mohawks.

Her feast day is July 14.

SAINT BONAVENTURE

In the great window on the east side of Mother of God church, in one of the lower panels, there is a picture of Saint Bonaventure. Bonaventure was an early Franciscan, and a brilliant scholar and theologian. He wrote one of the first biographies of Francis. His feast day is Tuesday, July 15.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Usually, a feast that begins, "Our Lady of …" indicates an apparition of the Blessed Mother. That is not the case of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Rather it is a feast recognizing the founding of the Carmelite Order, who took their name from Mound Carmel, in Israel, where they founded the first Carmelite Monastery, and dedicated the Order to the patronage of the Blessed Mother. The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is Wednesday, July 16.
