FROM THE PASTOR

VANITY OF VANITIES

The Book of Ecclesiastes is one of my favorite Old Testament Books. It contains some of the most beautiful poetry in the Bible. The writings are those of a very wise man named Qoheleth. It is called the Book of Ecclesiastes because it was used extensively by the early Church in its catechesis. (The Latin word for church is *ecclesia*).

In the passage that we read from this Sunday, Qoheleth calls out, "Vanities of vanities." He is saying that everything that exists is ultimately nothing. He has had wealth, success, popularity and power, and it has radically failed to satisfy his soul. He is coming to the realization that without God, nothing has value.

He writes as one who has worked hard to gain what he has, but his possessions and wealth, at his death, will go to someone who has done nothing for them. So, what is the point of working hard and struggling? We all die and leave it all behind.

Qoheleth is hitting bottom. He has sought to fill his heart with things that cannot fill it. Some have said that we have a God shaped hole in our hearts, and only God can fill them. But we all, to varying extents, try to fill them with possessions, pleasure, position, and power. The Four Big P's. Because they fail, we seek over and over to find that satisfaction, that sense of fulfillment, by trying over and over. This is the beginning of every addiction, which is a desperate, frantic seeking to fill and to numb the emptiness within.

Like Qoheleth, we must realize that only in God do we find the peace, the fulfillment, the happiness that we seek.

HOW DO I JOIN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH?

The Catholic Church provides a process known as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly known as RCIA) for those who over the age of nine to become Catholic. It is a process of catechesis (education in the Catholic faith, as well as certain rites and prayers to help them process.

There are three categories for those seeking entrance into

the Church: 1) Catechumens – those who have never been baptized into any denomination, 2) Candidates – those baptized in another Christian denomination, but who now wish to become full members of the Catholic Church, and 3) Baptized, but Uncatechized Catholics – those baptized as children, but not raised in the Church.

THE DEDICATION OF THE
BASILICA OF SAINT MARY MAJOR

There are four major basilicas in Rome - Saint Peter, Saint John Lateran, Saint Paul Outside the Walls, and Saint Mary Major. On Tuesday, August 4, the Church honors the Dedication of Saint Mary Major. In 431 BC, the Council of Ephesus declared Mary to be the Mother of God. At that point, this Basilica was built to commemorate this great event. It is the oldest church in the world dedicated to Mary, and of the four basilicas is the most beautiful. This was the church that Pope Francis always went to pray, when he returned to Rome from his travels. He also had a tomb built in the Basilica where he is now buried.

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

As Jesus and The Twelve approached Jerusalem, He began speaking to them of His Passion and Death. Their faith in Him was shaken. At that point, He took Peter, James and John up onto Mount Tabor where He was Transfigured. In a vision, they saw Him with Moses (the Lawgiver) and Elijah (the great prophet) symbolizing that the Old Testament (called the Law and the Prophets by the Jews) spoke of this reality. At the same time, the voice of God from Heaven proclaimed, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him."

Wednesday, August 6, is the Feast of the Transfiguration.

SAINT DOMINIC

A contemporary of Saint Francis of Assisi, Dominic was a brilliant scholar and preacher. He founded a community of men (the Order of Preachers [OP]) to preach against the heresies of the day. A second Dominican Order of Women was later founded, and a third order of laypeople.

Friday, August 8, is the Feast of Saint Dominic.

SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS

Edith Stein was a German Jewish philosopher, who converted to Catholicism, and became a Carmelite sister. She took the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. As Nazi Germany was rising, she was considered a Jew by race, despite her conversion. She and her sister were smuggled out of Germany to a convent in the Netherlands. Eventually, she was arrested and taken to Auschwitz, where she was murdered in a gas chamber.
