## FROM THE PASTOR

#### LAZARUS AND THE RICH MAN

There are two parables of Jesus about people going to Hell, and their sin is exactly the same. In Matthew 25, we have the great parable of judgment in which all are divided into sheep and goats. The sheep are welcomed into the Kingdom of God, because they has seen Jesus in the distressing disguise of the poor, and had responded to Him. "Whatsoever you do for the least of my brothers and sisters, you do unto Me." The goats are condemned to Hell because they did not respond to Him in that distressing disguise.

The second parable of being cast into Hell is the story we hear in today's Gospel of Lazarus and the Rich Man. Lazarus is a desperately poor man living on the streets outside the rich man's home. The rich man goes to Hell because he does not care about Lazarus and his sufferings.

We must hear this message and learn to see in the poor the face of Jesus. There are two things that will sever us from relationship with God and cut us off from salvation - refusing to forgive those who have hurt us and neglecting the poor. Each of us must examine ourselves and determine whether or not we are doing what Jesus calls us to do.

#### OCTOBER, THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

On Wednesday, we begin the month of October, which the Church celebrates as the Month of the Holy Rosary. One of the reasons that October is selected for this purpose is that the Feast of the Holy Rosary falls on October 7,

The Rosary is both meditative prayer and vocal prayer. As vocal prayer, there is the recitation of the prayers (the Apostles Creed, the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be, and the Fatima Prayer.) As meditative prayer, we are to reflect on the various mysteries of the Rosary, being drawn into the life, death, and Resurrection of Christ, and the role of His Blessed Mother in His life and ministry. It takes some practice to perform both the vocal and meditative aspects of the Rosary at the same time, but we can learn to do it.

I encourage everyone to pray the Rosary daily, as does Mary herself in a number of her apparitions. It will bear great fruit in your life.

#### **DEACON RETREAT**

Next weekend, the Deacons of the Diocese of Covington and their wives will be on retreat at Bergamo Retreat Center in Dayton, Ohio. I will be giving the retreat, so Deacon Brian and I will be out of the parish next Sunday.

Keep us in your prayers, and we will definitely keep you in ours.

#### MICHAEL SCHULTE ACOLYTE

Seminarian Michael Schulte, who was with us this summer, will receive the Order of Acolyte this Wednesday, October 1. Part of his preparation for priesthood, this Order is especially oriented toward the Eucharist. He will be an Ordinary Minister of the Eucharist, will be able to assist the priest at the altar, and to purify the vessels after Mass.

Please pray for Michael as he progresses in his studies and preparation for ordination to the priesthood.

## THE ARCHANGELS MICHAEL, GABRIEL AND RAPHAEL

On Monday, September 29, the Church honors the Archangels Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. They are significant servants of God. Michael is the great warrior, who led the angels in heaven who remained faithful to God in their war against Lucifer and his rebel angels, defeating them. He still is "our defender in battle" against the evil one. Gabriel is the great messenger of God, who brought to Mary the message that she would be the mother of the Son of God. Raphael shows up in the Book of Tobit, bringing healing to Tobit. He is, then, known as the bearer of the healing power of God.

## SAINT JEROME, PRIEST AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Saint Jerome was born in 342 ad and died in 420 AD. He is recognized as a Doctor of the Church because of his translation of the Bible from the original languages into Latin, which was the language of the people of his time. He wrote, not in the elegant formal Latin that was used by the scholars, but the "street Latin" of the people. This was considered "vulgar" by the scholars, so his translation of the Bible into Latin is known as the "Vulgate."

Jerome also wrote commentaries on many of the books of the Bible, as well as other theological texts.

His Feast is on Tuesday, September 30.

#### SAINT THERESE OF THE CHILD JESUS

Saint Therese, also known as The Little Flower, was one of the most popular of saints in the twentieth century. Therese of Lisieux was born on January 2, 1873 and died on September 30, 1897. She had three older sisters who became Carmelite sisters, joining the convent in their hometown of Lisieux. Therese joined as well. It was recognized very quickly that she was a woman of deep holiness, and her sister, who was the Mother Superior, asked her to write about her relationship with Christ, and her Little Way of holiness. This spiritual autobiography was called *The Story of a Soul*, when it was published after her death.

The Feast of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus is this Wednesday, October 1.

#### SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

After the Blessed Virgin Mary, the most popular saint of all time is Saint Francis of Assisi. Born in 1181, he died in 1226. Next year will be the 800th anniversary of Francis' death. Francis is known for his great love of poverty and of the poor. He is also associated with animals and all of creation. The prayer of Saint Francis and many of the actions of his life make him a patron of peace. Finally, he invented the first creche or Nativity Scene.

This Saturday, October 4, is the Feast of Saint Francis.




