

Instructions for signing up for a project:

- Before you sign up, please have the names and email addresses for each person that will be serving on the project.
- There is a brief description of the project along with some details which will include date, time and number of volunteers.
- Under the description for each project there is a list of available projects indicated by an arrow ➤
- Each project has a code which typically starts with the organization initials followed by a number (e.g. PHC3 or TTLM5)
- From this list, find the project you (or your group) want to pursue, INCLUDING THE DIY PROJECTS.
- Once you find the code, you can then go to the link for signing up.
- Click on the "Get Tickets" button
- Find your project code in the list of "tickets". It's a long list and may take time to find what you are looking for.
- Once you find the tickets, use the "+" and "-" buttons to select the number of spots you would like to secure
- Then click the "Register" button.
- You should see a notification that your registration was accepted
- Fill out the information for the person who is registering for the project(s) including cell #
- You will then need to fill out information (name and email address) for each person being added to the project.
- After you are finished, you and the people in the group will receive confirmation emails.
