

Small Group Discussion Guide

Sermon Title: *Wanted: Dead or Alive*

Text: Romans 6:1–14



Warm Up (Engage the Group)

- If someone made a movie about your life, what would the title be? Why?
- When you hear the phrase “Wanted: Dead or Alive,” what comes to mind? How does that phrase fit with the Christian life?
- Share a time when you tried to break a bad habit. What helped (or didn’t help) you change?



Know It (Dig into Scripture)

1. Read Romans 6:1–7. What does it mean to be “dead to sin”? How does Paul connect this to baptism?
2. Read Romans 6:8–11. How does being “alive to Christ” change the way we see our daily struggles?
3. Read Romans 6:12–14. Paul tells us not to let sin reign in our mortal bodies. What does it practically look like to “offer yourselves to God” instead?
4. Why do you think Paul frames the Christian life as both a death and a resurrection?



Share It (Personal Reflection)

- Where do you feel the tug of sin trying to “reign” in your life right now?
- Have you ever experienced a real sense of freedom from a sin struggle? What happened?
- How can seeing yourself as “alive in Christ” change the way you approach your identity, your past mistakes, or your future decisions?
- Who has been an example to you of someone living “alive to Christ”? What have you learned from them?



Live It (Application)

- What's one specific area of your life this week where you need to remember you are *dead to sin*?
- What's one way you can live *alive to Christ* in your relationships, workplace, or community?
- What's one action step you will take this week to “offer yourself to God” rather than to sin?
- End by praying for one another—asking God for strength to resist sin's pull and power to walk in the new life of Christ.
