DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 2. Just because the enemy came to steal, kill and destroy, doesn't mean he gets to. We can ask Jesus for the life that he gives. What might the enemy be trying to steal from you?
- 3. C.S. Lewis wrote, "There are two equal and opposite errors into which our race can fall about the devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe, and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them." What should be our focus in this prayer of protection?
- 4. Through testing, God can show you who you are, and also shape you into who you can become. What character traits is God growing in you through any current testing you may be facing?

ACTION STEP

Do you recognize that whenever you gather with the church, sing praises, pray, serve someone, listen to someone's story, read Scripture or share the Gospel, that you are "pushing back the powers of evil"? How does it make you feel to know that you are doing so?

What practical steps can you take this week to engage in these types of things more regularly?
