Faith Working Under Pressure

Why Has the Author Written This Letter?

- Because of the condition and circumstances of the believers to whom he is writing:
 - The danger of their "departing from the living God" (3:12), "falling away" (6:6) from the glorious truths of the gospel, and "shrinking back" (10:39) to the Old Testament sacrificial system which served only as a type and shadow of the Great High Priest, the Lord Jesus Christ, and his once for all sacrifice for their sins (9:11-12, 24-28; 10:11-12) which is superior to everything under the old covenant (7:18-19)
 - The discouragement they felt because of their "hard struggle with sufferings" and "being publicly exposed to reproach and affliction" and even the confiscation of their property and imprisonment (10:32-34; 13:3).
- As a "word of exhortation" (13:22) or encouragement:
 - The letter contains many **warnings**, giving examples from God's people in previous generations who succumbed to danger and discouragement (3:7-4:11; 6:1-8; 10:26-31; 12:12-17, 25-29).
 - o The warnings are ALWAYS followed by pastoral words of comfort and encouragement:
 - "Exhort one another daily" 3:13
 - "Hold the beginning of your confidence steadfast unto the end" 3:13
 - "We which believe do enter into rest" 4:3
 - "They SHALL enter into my rest" 4:3,5
 - "Beloved, we are persuaded better things of you, and the things which accompany salvation" 6:9
 - "We have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us" 6:18
 - "We are not of them that draw back unto perdition" 10:39
 - "You are come unto mount Zion, unto the city of the living God" 12:22-23
 - What is it that will cause them to endure danger and discouragement? FAITH. Not a merely intellectual belief that God will deliver them in the end, but a faith that actively lives moment by moment by faith in the future and final fulfillment of God's promises, even as present danger and discouragement calls into question the veracity of those promises. What does this active, living faith look like?
 - Guarding our hearts from being hardened against God by our unbelief: 3:12
 - Holding fast our confidence: in God, in his Word, and in his promises: 3:6, 14; 10:23, 35-36

His oath, his covenant, his blood Support me in the whelming flood When all around my soul gives way, He then is all my hope and stay.

- Persevering (enduring) under trials: patience 6:12,15; 10:36; 12:2
 - "unto the end" 3:6; 3:14:6:11
 - "the hope set before us" 6:18
 - "Jesus, the author and <u>finisher</u> of our faith" 12:2
 - "receiving the end of your faith" 1 Peter 1:9
- Rejoicing in hope, recognizing that Christ is our hope: 3:6; 6:11, 17-20; 7:19
- Drawing near to God through Christ: 4:14-16; 10:19-22; 12:2-3

"boldly" in 4:16 and "boldness" in 10:19 (KJV) is the same Greek work translated "confidence" in 3:6, 3:14, and 10:35

Our confidence is in our great high priest who is interceding for us (7:24-25) on and from his throne of grace

- **Exhorting one another**: 3:13; 10:24-35; 12:12-14
 - parakaleō call to one's side for comfort, encouragement, and strength
 - The word Jesus used of the ministry of the Holy Spirit in John 14:16,26
 - "beseeching" (making strong appeals) to those who are doubting, discouraged, and in danger of shrinking back or living contrary to their faith in the gospel: 1 Corinthians 1:10; 2 Corinthians 6:1; 7:6-7; Ephesians 4:1; Philippians 4:2; 1 Thessalonians 2:11; 4:1; 5:11, 14; 2 Thessalonians 3:12; 2 Timothy 4:2; Titus 1:9; 2:15; 1 Peter 2:11; Jude 3
 - An intentional, personal, one-to-one ministry of admonition:
 - o 2 Corinthians 1:4-6
 - o Colossians 3:12-17

Eric Alexander: "We often speak about Hebrews chapter 11 as 'God's Picture Gallery of Faith,' but it is much more than that. It is primarily a series of biblical illustrations of *faith working under fire*. That's why the author chooses these particular instances. It is faith under fire that he is speaking about. Not just faith in a general sense, but faith in a specific sense: *faith under pressure*."

Without denying the very **real pain** of our present circumstances, faith works with a future focused confidence (11:13) to **a real person** (2:9-18), who is **a real priest** (4:14-5:10; 7:22-28; 9:11-12; 10:11-13; 12:24) securing **real promises** (6:13-20), which will be fulfilled in **a real place** of eternal peace and safety (11:16; 12:22-23) by the Captain of our Salvation (2:10), the Author and Finisher of our faith (12:2), the risen and reigning Lord Jesus Christ (13:20-21).
