"For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

Forgiveness and Mercy

We must forgive and show mercy.

Not a single **one of us deserved** the **forgiveness** Jesus gave us. It is only right to show forgiveness to people even when **we** think **they** do not deserve it.

On that note, **vengeance** is the Lord's and **people** who do wrong to you despite your **kindness** to them are **storing** up God's wrath for themselves.

Remember, their sin **against you** was against God *first*.

A new commandment I give to you, that you **love one another; as I have loved you**, that you also love one another.

John 13:34 NKJV





We must always give forgiveness.

But it is *NOT* always necessary to *TELL* someone that we forgave them.

If someone **asks** for forgiveness, **grant** *it* and **be gracious** as you **tell them**. God commands us to give forgiveness so that we can restore our relationships with each other.

But, if they do **not ask**, you do **not need** to tell them *with words* that you forgave them. Showing them **kindness** and **mercy** in your interactions with them *should* tell them of your **forgiveness**.

Do not forget to forgive yourself also. Dwelling on your past mistakes will not change them.

Do not allow Satan to **use** your past sins against you. **If** you let him, he will convince **you** that you are not **worthy** of forgiveness.

Let us save him the trouble. You, *like* the rest of us, are not worthy. *We* have already determined that. But the grace of God is *beautiful* and *sufficient*.

Jesus died and rose again so we can all have forgiveness. Nothing you have ever done is bigger than the sacrifice that Jesus made.
