# Internal volunteer opportunities





#### communion volunteers (Roseville Campus)

Communion is served the approx. 14 times a year. The first Sunday of the month, in addition to Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday. Communion Stewards: Training Provided

Purchase and prepare the elements (grape juice & bread) for communion. Chris Rohde bakes gluten free bread for communion and it is kept in the Linden Lounge kitchen freezer. Set up instructions are posted in the sacristy. After the service there is a small amount of clean up that had to be done. Reimbursement forms can be completed and put in Greg Wagner's mailbox in the office.

Currently we have two Stewards sharing this position and would welcome at least two more volunteers.

#### **Communion Stewards:**

Arrive approx. 30 minutes before the service to get instructions, most often you will be serving the communion cups.

It's helpful if you sit closer to the front during the service.

Currently the Pastors are asking folks to serve just before the service. We'd love to have folks sign up before Sunday using REALM.

#### Ushering (Roseville campus)

Do you enjoy meeting and greeting people? Are you interested in helping to prepare the Roseville sanctuary for services, collecting the offering and assuring that everyone feels welcomed? If so, please consider joining the Ushering Team at the Roseville campus!

Ushers arrive 15-30 minutes before the service start time and stay afterwards for about 15 minutes. Anyone can be an usher and there is always one or more experienced usher scheduled every Sunday who will provide training and answer questions. A monthly schedule is posted in the small room near the name tags at Roseville (a.k.a. The Ushers' Closet) and you can leave a note or your contact information for the ushers there. The posted schedule includes Sunday services and special services, such as Holy Week and Christmas Eve services and seasonal events such as the annual Christmas Concert.

Holy Hammers is a coalition of 15 churches that work together to provide homes for families who are striving to access affordable homeownership. The relationship between Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity and Holy Hammers started in 1999, and continues to this day. The coalition of churches from the northern suburbs of St. Paul is celebrating its 26th year of partnership with Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity and has committed over \$1.5 million to Habitat's mission. Every year, the coalition churches provide around 500 volunteers that support 8 weeks of construction. The churches also raise an average of \$76,000 toward home sponsorship yearly.

The coalition is strong, but is always willing to welcome new churches! Whether its construction volunteers, folks helping to raise fund, or those who make and help serve lunches for volunteers - Holy Hammers loves to welcome new friends and partners in service.

Habitat not only helps build community through providing families with a permanent home and neighborhood, it also allows workers to connect with each other.
