## Ephesians 1:1-6

### It's All God's Doing: Chosen, Redeemed, Adopted

#### I. Announce:

- A. Welcome those online.
- B. Slide1 REAL: LAST summer REAL on Tues night, Aug.12th at 7pm. Many of you weren't *able to come to* the **retreat** this year, so we are taking our theme on what it means to be **Busy About our Father's Business**. (message, fun, fellowship).
- C. Slide2 Foundations: Foundations will help you level up your understanding of *Christian teachings & focus your biblical worldview*.
  10 weeks, Sept. 7-Nov. 9. Enroll at calvarymurrieta.com/classes.
- D. Slide3 Divorce Care: Our next session will start on Mon, Aug. 18th at 6:30pm. It's a 13-week support group for those that may be separated, in the early stages of divorce or have been divorced for any length of time. This can be a lonely and confusing time. Come and join in, and begin your healing journey.
- E. Slide4 Calvary Kids Christmas Play Auditions: Calling all actors! We are looking to fill out our cast for our next Christmas play. All 1st-8th grade students are welcome to audition for a speaking role or singing role. Those who prefer to be in the choir only do not need to audition. - G. Slide6 Ephesians Who we <u>are</u> in Christ How we <u>walk</u> with Christ.
- H. Prayer: Oh God help us to take this book *personally*.

#### II. Slide7 Intro: It's All God's Doing: Chosen, Redeemed, Adopted

A. Slide8 Tim Keller, "Ephesians gives us a <u>window</u> into the heart of God: His plan of salvation was always designed to bring us into His family as His children. It is **a** love letter showing the <u>depth</u> and <u>height</u> of His love that we might comprehend with all saints."

- B. Here's our quick historical background: (we learn from Acts 19)
  - 1. On Paul's 2nd missionary journey he visited Ephesus, left Aquila & Priscilla behind. He returned 2 years later and ministered for 3 years.
  - 2. Years later while under house arrest in <u>Rome</u> he writes this letter to the believers in Ephesus [3 other prison epistles: *Philippines, Colossians, Philemon*]
  - 3. Ephesus was famous for its temple to Diana/Artemis (7th Wonder of the Ancient world). Ephesus emerged as *the religious center* of all Asia. They had a stadium that held 50,000 spectators. This is where the riot broke out regarding Paul & his friends. Extraordinary miracles took place by the hands of Paul ... people were healed from handkerchiefs & aprons laid on the sick, that had touched Paul's skin. Acts 19:11,12
- C. In 2 weeks Kel & I celebrate our 42nd anniversary. When we started dating I let her know early in our relationship that I had my eye on her for a long time. I was attracted to her before she knew it. I liked her before she liked me. God says the same to us, in this letter!
  - 1. Your parents may have communicated to you: you weren't planned. You were an accident. You were a mistake. You'll never amount to anything.
    - a) I can't fix your past, but I can point to our present truth, and our future hope.
- D. Slide9 Let's read this *Love Letter* from God to His children. READ 1:1-6

#### III. Slide 10 HE EMBEDDED US (1-2)

- A. Embedded means to fix firmly and deeply in a surrounding mass. Dictionary
  - 1. Paul's opening greeting reminds that salvation is **rooted in** God's unchanging purpose. (not in us)
    - a) Paul was an apostle *by the will of God*. The saints are *in Christ Jesus*. Grace and peace are rooted come *from* both the Father and the Son.
  - 2. So both grace and peace are both **not** based on your performance.
- B. Speak to camera prayer time.

- C. Questions for prayer: If our <u>relationship</u> with God is **rooted in** God's unchanging purpose rather than on *our works, goodness, or performance*. How should you thank Him?
  - 1. Remind yourself, grace and peace are not based on my performance.
  - 2. Mediatate on: *In Christ* refers to the believer's union and identification with Christ. [in Christ **12** x's in Eph **87** x's in NT]
- IV. Slide11a HE BLESSED US (3) [note:3-14 form a single sentence in the GK text. Longest in the Bible]
  - A. See all the words *blessed* or *blessing & Praise* (like the 1st word used).
  - B. Every spiritual blessing is found in Christ and kept in the vault of Heaven.
    - 1. In the heavenly places because that's where they're found(as opposed to earth).
      - a) Proton Mail is an App I have (like What's App or Signal w/end to end encryption) I laughed when I read about it's **security**: 1 of the 3 places where **Proton Mail** is <u>hosted</u> is in Attinghausen, *in the former K7 military bunker*, *under 3,300 ft of granite*.
    - 2. So this is where every sp blessing originates and
  - C. Every spiritual blessing refers to every spiritual enrichment needed for the spiritual life.
    - 1. Since these benefits have already been given to us believers, we should not ask for them but rather appropriate them by faith.
    - 2. Similarly **Joshua** was not to ask for land since God had already promised it to him(Josh.1:3,4). But he was to *enter into the enjoyment* of that provision.
  - D. Paul reminds us we are sp rich beyond measure ... yet often living like sp beggars.
    - 1. Why? Because we're ignorant of our wealth.
    - 2. Slide11b The great Scottish Bible expositor Alexander MacLaren wrote: We may have as much of God as we will. Christ puts the key of the treasure-chamber into our hand, and bids us take all that we want. If a man is admitted into the vault of a bank and told to help himself, and comes out with 1 cent, whose fault is it that he is poor?

- E. Questions for prayer: In Christ, we are made partakers of *every spiritual blessing*. This should lead us to worship and gratitude.
- V. Slide12 **HE CHOSE US (4)** *elected us* (formerly applied to Israel alone)
  - A. We were **Planned** from the beginning by the Father. **Purchased** by the Son. And **Preserved** by the Spirit.
    - 1. This is *the bedrock of confidence* for the believer.
    - 2. But what about those He didn't chose? He's not trying to answer all of our questions. He's trying to "whisper sweet somethings in your ear" ... if you'll have ears to hear?
  - B. **Purpose** for this choosing? The goal of God's choosing is not just salvation but transformation, to make us **holy** & **blameless** in His sight, *through* the work of Jesus.
    - 1. Choosing promotes and demands holiness. Holiness is the <u>revealing evidence</u> of being elected/chosen.
    - 2. God's choosing has a purpose: that we might be *transformed into the image of Christ*, *displaying* His holiness.
  - C. Questions for prayer: Ask God to stir you to pursue holiness, knowing that God's purpose is to sanctify us through Jesus.
  - D. If you were *chosen in Him before the foundation of the world* how will that <u>change</u> <u>your view</u> of your relationship with God today? (no longer try to make Him like you?)
  - E. What does it look like in your life to be **holy** and **blameless** in Christ?
- VI.Slide13 **HE ADOPTED US (5)** *predestined us* (predestined 5 x's *who* not what)
  - A. We were predestined for something for adoption.
  - B. According not to (what we've done or what He saw we would do). But according to the <u>purpose</u> of **His will**. [this is the only explanation, can we just leave it there?]
    - 1. The reason is found in God and not you. Period!

- C. God, in His grace, adopts us as His children through Jesus Christ. This is not just a **legal** change, but a *relational* one, bringing us into the family of God.
- D. A quote from a judge on a couples adoption day of their son. "From today on, he is your son. He may disappoint you, even grieve you but he is your son. Everything you own one day will be his and he will bear your name." Then he looked to the clerk and gave this command. "So order a change in this child's birth certificate and may it reflect that these are the parents of this child."
- E. In NT times they usually didn't adopt babies, they waited till they were older so they could see *character*. And did you know, God doesn't adopt cute lil kids but adopts enemies.
- F. Questions for prayer: Meditate on this: through Jesus, you are adopted into God's family. Your **identity** is now rooted in Christ. You are *no longer orphans*, but children of the living God.

#### VII.Slide14a HE THUS, RECEIVES OUR PRAISE (6)

- A. The ultimate <u>purpose</u> of our salvation is *the praise of God's glorious grace*, which is freely given to us in the Beloved (Jesus Christ).
  - 1. The response to God's grace should be a life of worship and praise.
- B. In Heb.10:10 we see **our standing**/position in (we <u>have been</u> sanctified/set apart) In Heb.10:14 we see **our state**/condition in (we <u>are being</u> sanctified).
  - 1. Here we've been learning about the first, our standing/our position.
- C. To the praise of **His** glorious grace (also in 12,14) Wait, it's not all about me?
  - 1. God saves sinners not to solve their problems, but to bring glory to Himself. (say again) Slide14b So, God gets the glory ... you get the joy!
- D. Questions for prayer: This passage calls us to reflect on the profound grace of God that has chosen us, predestined us for adoption, and transformed our identity through Jesus Christ. We are blessed with every spiritual blessing in Him, and our lives should reflect a grateful response to the amazing love and grace of God.
