DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are designed to help you talk about God's word and Pastor Brian's message with friends and family. You of course can use your own questions, but we'd like to give you this tool to encourage Biblical fellowship and discipleship in your circle of relationships. *Enjoy discovering more about Him!*

"FROM BLURRY TO CLEAR" | MARK 8: 1-30 | PASTOR BRIAN BELL

WARM-UP QUESTION:

How often do you struggle with your vision? What's it like?

"Jesus Feeds 4000" Mark 8: 1-10

Jesus miraculously feeds 4000+ people out of compassion with only 7 loaves and few fish after being together for 3 days. Why is it impactful to experience power with compassion? What are ways people experience Jesus' power compassionately today?

"Pharisees Demand A Sign and Jesus Warns of Yeast of Pharisees and Herod" Mark 8: 11-21

Jesus leaves the Pharisees after they demand signs from heaven. He then warns disciples against being spiritually blind like others. How can skepticism hinder spiritual growth? What are ways people focus on the temporary and miss deeper spiritual lessons?

"Healing of the Blind Man" Mark 8: 22-26

In Bethsaida Jesus heals a blind man in stages. Why might Jesus heal in stages instead of at once? How does God gradually clear up someone's spiritual vision?

"Peter's Confession of the Messiah" Mark 8: 27-30

Jesus asks the disciples who do people say He is, and Peter declares Jesus to be Christ. **How would you describe Jesus? How does** that belief impact how you live?

REFLECTION QUESTION:

Jesus uses many miracles and lessons to gradually reveal He is Lord and Savior. It takes time for people to move out of spiritual blindness, but He is compassionate in this process. Have you been guilty of demanding more proof from God when He's already shown His faithfulness? Have you been focusing on wrong things and missing what Jesus wants to show you? Ask God to forgive you, to give you clarity on His will for your life, and to live with Jesus as King.

Jesus Journal: Write down at least one thing about Jesus that impressed you in the passage and message.

From Blurry to Clear:

I. Announce:

II. Slide6,7auto Intro:

- A. Theme: From Blurry to Clear: Seeing Jesus for Who He Truly Is.
 - 1. We'll watch the journey from *spiritual blindness* towards clarity—<u>both</u> in the **disciples** *and* in **us**.
- B. Mark 8:1-30 contains 5 *interconnected stories* that reveal key aspects of Jesus' identity *and* mission. *Slide8 See Map.
- C. How many of you have worn glasses? contacts? Had LASIKs/or eye surgery?
 - 1. When I was in my 20s, my eyesight was pretty bad—everything was blurry. Glasses helped, but they were a hassle, always searching for them, remembering to bring them everywhere. Then I moved to contacts. They worked better, but what a hassle taking them out at night, putting them back in in the morning. Eventually, I was able to get LASIK surgery. Suddenly, for the first time in years, I could wake up and see clearly. It was incredible! But I was told after 5 years I'd prob need reading glasses for seeing up close (doc was spot on). Even now, I still need my readers and also daily re-wetting drops to keep things clear. Without them, my eyes get dry.

a) Looking back—my journey with **my eyesight** is <u>a lot like</u> my spiritual journey in understanding who Jesus is.

D. Prayer:

III. Slide9a JESUS FEEDS 4000 PEOPLE (1-10) READ

A. DOUBTING THE BREAD OF LIFE

- B. Slide9b Repeat? 5000 now 4000? Nope, 2 different events.
 - 1. Feeding 5000 took place on the mid/**Western** shore of Galilee; [4000 on the North **Eastern** shore]. Also, 5000 men; [4000 people]
 - 2. 5000 involved predominantly **Jews**; [4000 involved mostly **Gentiles**]
 - 3. 5000 involved 5 loaves & 2 fish; [4000 involved 7 loaves, a few small fish.
 - 4. 5000 the people had been w/Him 1 day; [4000 the people had 3 days]
 - 5. 5000 had 12 <u>little</u> baskets of fragments left over; [4000 had 7 <u>large</u>]
 - 6. 5000 Jesus prayed 1 time; [4000 Jesus prayed 2 times over bread & fish] [Lastly, Jesus says it was 2 different events!!! (8:19,20)]
- C. We see Jesus' miraculous provision showing once again, His **power** and **compassion** always meets and exceeds the demand.
 - 1. They ate and were satisfied once again Our **souls**, so to speak, are **elastic**. The more we **eat** (sp) the more they **expand**. The more they **expand**, the more we are **able to eat**. [stretchy pants/Nacho stretchy souls!]
- D. Application: When we feel spiritually empty or overwhelmed, Jesus not only sees our need but is capable of meeting it. (not that he's just our divine need-meet'r)
 - 1. Paul Trip summarizes the <u>math</u> of Mark's gospel well: Jesus' compassion + His power = everything we need.
- E. Reflection Question: What areas of your life need the compassionate touch of Jesus today?

IV. Slide10a PHARISEES DEMAND A SIGN (11-13) READ

A.BLIND BY UNBELIEF

B. Story: The Pharisees demand a sign, revealing their hardness of heart.

- 1. Faith doesn't ask for signs.
- C. Slide 10b Key Point: Even in the presence of miracles, their unbelief blinds them.
 - 1. Jesus did so many miracles—would they believe if they saw 1 more?
 - 2. What was Jesus reaction? He sighed deeply. (single strong word in Gk; found only here in the NT). The *willful unbelief* of the religious leaders *disturbed Christ to the depths of His spirit*.
 - 3. And He left them it was an act of judgment, refusing the Pharisees.
- **D**. Application: Are we ever guilty of *demanding more proof* from God when He's already shown His faithfulness?
- E. Reflection Question: How does skepticism hinder our spiritual growth? [skeptic vs. skepticism]

V. Slide11a YEAST OF THE PHARISEES & HEROD (14-21) READ

A.MISSING THE SPIRITUAL TRUTHS

- B. Story: Jesus warns about the *yeast/leaven* of the Pharisees and Herod, but the disciples think He's talking about bread.
 - 1. Slide11b Boys—He fed 1000's of folks w/bread. Why worry/argue over 1 loaf, when the Bread of Life is in your boat?
 - a) Their **minds** were dull; their **hearts** were hard; their **spiritual eyes** were blind; and their **spiritual ears** were deaf. And so often are mine :(
 - b) Or it's been said, It wasn't so much that they **forgot** the <u>bread</u>, as much as they **missed** the <u>loaf</u>.
 - 2. The real lesson wasn't only about *bread*—but about *leaven*/yeast. **Evil**, like *leaven*, is small & hidden, but it spreads quickly, & soon infects the whole.
 - 3. Watch out (Jesus only said when it was of the utmost importance 5x's).
 - a) Legalism was the Pharisees teaching to watch for. Worldliness was Herod's teaching to watch for. Liberalism was the Sadducees teachings to watch for. And you and I would be wise to watch for these 3 today!

- C. (17) Here Jesus drills them with **8 rapid fire questions**. [up to this point the disciples asked the Rabbi question—NOW the Rabbi starts grilling/interrogating them]
 - 1. I'm sure when He got done with the 8th question—all you could hear was the oars dragging in the water.
 - 2. Oh they knew the answers, but didn't understand the meaning.
- D.(21) Do you not yet understand? I think in this last question it wasn't *a* continuation of a rebuke, but as a searching appeal to the disciples. Like, Now, do you still not understand I am the Bread of Life for the whole world?
- E. Slide11c Application: Sometimes we get caught up in *the physical* and miss *the deeper spiritual lesson*.
- F. Reflection Question: What bread are <u>we</u> focusing on when we should be listening for Jesus' deeper teaching?

VI.Slide12a HEALING OF THE BLIND MAN (22-26) READ key passage

A.GRADUAL SIGHT

- B. Story: Jesus heals the blind man in 2 stages—partial sight, then full clarity.
 - This miracle/story is only found here. Actually also the miracle/story of feeding the 4000 is only inserted here by Mark. There must be a purpose. Yes, sandwiched in-between Jesus teaches on unbelief.
 - Slide12b And this is the only miracle that took place in stages. And the
 only time Jesus asked how they're doing. If the miracle worked—Can you
 see? (usually He commanded something).
 - 3. Picture for a moment these two walking hand-in-hand. One completely blind, and the other with *perfect spiritual vision*.
 - a) Maybe because Bethsaida was *under judgment*. So Jesus *took the man out of there* and told him *not to go back* (26). [he wasn't from there]
- C. Slide12c Key Point: Spiritual vision is often a process—sometimes God brings clarity gradually. > 9 verbs were used in these 5 vs, for *vision*.
- D. Application: Be patient with yourself and others in the **process** of *spiritual growth*.

E. Reflection Question: Where is God gradually clearing up your spiritual vision?

VII.Slide13a PETER'S CONFESSION OF THE MESSIAH (27-30) READ 25mi. N.

A.CLEARER VISION

- B. Story: Jesus asks, *Who do you say I am?* (am I still just a fuzzy walking tree to you???) and Peter responds, *You are the Messiah*.
- C. Key Point: *Yet* despite his confession, Peter's understanding is still <u>incomplete</u>—proof that seeing Jesus clearly—takes time.
- D. Application: Confessing Jesus as Lord is *the beginning*, not the end of our spiritual journey.
- E. Slide13b Reflection Question: Who do u say Jesus is, & how is that impacting yur life?
- F. The confession of Jesus as the Messiah marks the midpoint of this gospel and the turning point in Jesus ministry.
 - Slide13c Book break: Servant/Sacrifice. OK now you guys understand the Who ... now you need to understand the What/the Son of man must suffer many things.

VIII.GOING DEEPER: Moving from Blurry to Clear

- A. Challenge: Let's jump across the age to us, *How is your sp.sight? How is your sp.hearing? How is your heart?* Reflect on any areas of spiritual blindness or partial understanding. Pray for clearer spiritual vision.
- B. *Praise God in another account it says, *I can see clearly now* the rain is gone. *I can see all obstacles in my way. Gone are the dark clouds that had me blind. It's gonna be a bright (bright), bright (bright). Sun-shiny day.* Johnny Nash—1972.
- C. Looking back, my journey with **my eyesight** is a lot like **my spiritual journey** in understanding who Jesus is. Blurry beginnings. A little clearer. Clear vision. A little foggy again. Daily Maintenance. [process. progress. steps. journey]
- D. Prayer: Lord, we admit, we need a 2nd touch. So many things are sill unclear. Open our eyes to see You more clearly. Help us move from blurry faith to clear

conviction, as You gradually reveal more of Yourself to us. (Give us Ears to hear. Eyes to see. Hearts to understand. The Will to make right decisions/choices).
