Growth Group Guide

Topic: Boundaries as Blessing – Joshua 15

Opening Question:

When you think about 'boundaries,' do you usually see them as restrictions or blessings? Why?

Key Scripture:

- Joshua 15:1 (CSB): Now the allotment for the tribe of the descendants of Judah by their clans was from the southern border to the wilderness of Zin in the extreme south.
- Joshua 15:13–14 (CSB): He gave Caleb son of Jephunneh the following portion among the descendants of Judah based on the LORD's instruction to Joshua: Kiriath-arba (that is, Hebron; Arba was the father of Anak). Caleb drove out from there the three sons of Anak: Sheshai, Ahiman, and Talmai, descendants of Anak.
- Joshua 15:18–19 (CSB): When she arrived, she persuaded Othniel to ask her father for a field. As she got off her donkey, Caleb asked her, 'What do you want?' She replied, 'Give me a blessing. Since you have given me land in the Negev, give me the springs also.' So he gave her the upper and lower springs.
- Joshua 15:63 (CSB): But the descendants of Judah could not drive out the Jebusites who lived in Jerusalem, so the Jebusites live in Jerusalem among the descendants of Judah to this day.
- Psalm 16:5–6 (CSB): LORD, you are my portion and my cup of blessing; you hold my future. The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; indeed, I have a beautiful inheritance.
- John 4:14 (CSB): But whoever drinks from the water that I will give him will never get thirsty again. In fact, the water I will give him will become a well of water springing up in him for eternal life.

Main Points:

- 1. God's boundaries are intentional, not random—they are drawn in love for our good (Josh 15:1; Ps 16:5–6).
- 2. Caleb shows us courage to claim God's promises within his boundaries (Josh 15:13–14).
- 3. Achsah models bold faith—asking for springs to make her portion fruitful (Josh 15:18–19).

- 4. Even within God's boundaries, challenges remain (Josh 15:63), reminding us to depend on Him.
- 5. Jesus fulfills and transforms boundaries, giving us living water and eternal inheritance (John 4:14).

Key Takeaways:

- God's boundaries are gifts, not punishments.
- Courage and bold faith help us thrive within His boundaries.
- Boundaries are platforms for God's blessing to overflow to others.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What do the boundaries in Joshua 15 teach us about God's faithfulness and provision?
- 2. How does Achsah's bold request challenge or encourage you in your own prayers?
- 3. Where do you see 'unfinished business' within your boundaries? How might God be using it for growth?
- 4. How can you shift your perspective to see limits as invitations for God's blessing?
- 5. What does it mean for you personally to live sent within the boundaries God has given you?

Next Steps:

This week, join us in prayer: Ask God to help you see His boundaries as blessings and to give you courage to trust Him within them.

Individual: Identify one area in your life that feels limiting and ask God how He wants to bless you there.

Accountability: Share with your group one way you will trust God's provision within your boundaries this week.

Scripture: Memorize Psalm 16:6 (CSB): 'The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; indeed, I have a beautiful inheritance.'

LIVE SENT: Encourage someone in your community by sharing how God has blessed you within your current boundaries.
