A New Year. New health goals.

There is something nice and fresh in thinking about the new year. It is clean, like new fresh sheets, or a new, blank piece of paper. It is full of opportunity and comforting in its own way.

Many of us will take this opportunity to make new health goals for ourselves. It is also easier for us to do that now, after the season of sweet treat gifting is over.



Did you know that the founder of Methodism, John Wesley, was actually a proponent of healthy practices? He saw the connection between physical health and spiritual, emotional and mental health. He even published his thoughts and recommendations for healthy practices and it became a best seller. Even though it was written in the year 1847 he gave advice that most of us would agree are healthy practices even today. Some notables from the document include: keep a clean house and body, stay away from smoked, pickled or salted foods, "water is the wholesomest of all the drinks", "spiritous liquors are a certain and slow poison," exercise is necessary to good, long health, walking is the best exercise, and walking outside is even better. Also going to bed at 9:00 pm, and waking at 4:00 am is good for us.

He also had advice for curing baldness: "rub the part morning and evening, with onions, till it is red, and rub it afterwards with honey. - or wash it with a decoction of boxwood. - Or electrify it daily." Hmmm. interesting.

Most of all, John Wesley knew that even the knowledge of how to care and treat our health was a gift from God.

"Wesley understood that physical and spiritual health were connected. In a letter dated October 26, 1778, he offers this telling advice to his friend, Alexander Knox:

Alleck... it will be a double blessing if you give yourself up to the Great Physician, that He may heal soul and body together. And unquestionably this is His design. He wants to give you...both inward and outward health.

A WONDERFUL DONATION

If you have been in church recently, you may have seen 4 brand new wooden offering plates. Here is their story:

The plates were crafted and hand polished by Larry Barr of Cattaraugus, NY. They were commissioned by Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, in Paradise Valley, AZ as a memorial for a dear member, Elliot Perriott, who passed away after a long battle with cancer, at too young an age.

Larry Barr was the uncle of Ann Skipper, previous member of Spirit Song Church and member of New Song Church who served at Gloria Dei as their Administrator for over 22 years. The plates were used in worship until the church closed in 2021. Gloria Dei became a Federated Church with Palo Christi Presbyterian Church in 2022, becoming Gloria Christi Federated Church. Gloria Christ closed in 2024 and Ann was given back the plates because of her family connection.

Ann has lovingly given them to New Song UMC to be used and to glorify God in our worship services.

There are several opportunities at New Song for adults to learn more about our faith.


