

Empathy

Recently the word has sparked emotional differences of opinions.

Author Joe Rigney presents the idea that empathy is a sin. For him, empathy brings a person down into the pit with the person suffering. For Rigney, empathy contributes to a person compromising their values.

Jack Shitama (podcast speaker on non anxious leadership) summarizes this point of view in this way:



Shitama goes on to take a greater look at empathy by looking at our current understanding of empathy which is broken into two categories: affective empathy and cognitive empathy. Affective empathy is the ability to respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Cognitive empathy is the ability to understand another's perspective that is different from your own.

Affective empathy has two types of responses: empathic concern and personal distress. Empathic concern is the ability to respond with compassion and care. Personal distress is a feeling of discomfort and anxiety in response to another's suffering. Guess which one might be a problem.

When we get overly distressed about someone's condition, we have a tendency to try to make quick fixes to relieve our own anxiety about the other person's pain or position. When this happens, people can easily over function. We end up harming others by doing for them instead of teaching, coaching or even just being present for them in their pain. I believe this is a little bit of where Rigney was heading.

Here are my thoughts. If you find yourself changed by hearing someone's life story or pain and struggle, that is not a sin. It is mercy. It is compassion. It is having your heart strangely warmed. The best course of action as we find ourselves changed is to try and understand our feelings, and the other person (cognitive empathy.) Then we need to understand our role in the situation. Do I need to be a cheerleader? Do I need to communicate

this situation to another person who can bring change? How can I empower the person experiencing pain and suffering to make positive changes in their lives? Is there systemic change that needs to happen (through law making or legal intervention?) These are places to start when we empathize with someone going through a hard time.

Alan Bean from the Baptist News contributes a more theological look at empathy: "Empathy isn't an emotion, it's an orientation." A person will never be able to "feel" what another feels. So, that is not what empathy is.

Instead, "empathy says, 'You matter.' ... If we follow Jesus, even our enemies must matter to us because they matter to God. You may not understand me, and I may not understand you, but we are wonderfully tangled in an interdependent web. We need one another. We love one another. We value one another."

Adventure: an exciting or very unusual experience (Dictionary .com)

It was a ridiculously hot and humid day in August when Bandit and I started our adventure. I threw the stuff we were taking in the trunk of my vehicle. I would transfer stuff to the travel trailer when we reached a cooler spot. We were headed to Minnesota for my class reunion, also to deliver a set of dishes to a deceased friend's niece who lives near Minneapolis. The dishes had been her great-grandmother Nana's, as I called her. I also wanted to visit a friend who moved to the Minneapolis area to be closer to his children.

Adventure #1- occurred just outside of Holbrook, Az. I looked to my left and saw a big semi-truck inches from my review mirror. He corrected, passed me, and drove onto the shoulder of the road. This erratic driving continued until the turn off towards Holbrook. I also noticed another big rig pulled over to the right lane and followed him. I hope that he intervened.

Adventure #2, day 2-Occurred in New Mexico near to Tucumcari. I wanted to travel on "54" to Guymon Oklahoma and spend my 2nd night there. GPS had a different plan. I was directed to turn on a county road and travel? miles. I turned as directed and within a few feet I knew I didn't want that road-after a short drive on black top curve there was just gravel surrounded by fields. I tried to back up a few times, without success. I was scared and lost (I need lessons on backing up). I decided to continue on the gravel road. No traffic, lot of ruts and bumps. I did come to a yard of some sort and was able to make a U-turn and return to the black top. Somehow, I made it to Guymon-stayed for two nights at a clean, grassy camp site and watched two beautiful sunsets.

Adventure #3-somewhere in the rural Nebraska farmlands. A huge tractor was driving in front of me-no traffic. He pulled over a bit onto the shoulder and signaled to me that it was OK to pass. I pulled out and as I did a big black fast, moving SUV, decided he was going to pass me. There we were three vehicles on a two-lane highway with a car coming towards us. Fortunately, the SUV was going extremely fast, and we were safe.

Adventure #4-occurred on the way out of the campground heading for I-25 south. The coupler became dislodged from the ball. The coupler had attached to the ball with a clamping sound the and the "lock" went into place. WOW! That was easy. But my gut said it was not secure. I did not listen to my gut and pulled out of my spot. I got a half block, still in the park, and the coupler became dislodged with a giant clang!! By the time I got out of my car to check things out, there were 4-5 men who came to check what was going on. They lifted the travel trailer & securely replaced the coupler over the ball, checked to ensure the electrical system was working-it wasn't. 2-3 guys stayed with me to check out the system. One even went to a store to buy a new plug and installed it. About 2 hours later they could not figure out what was causing the system not to work. One guy called a garage he had used in the past and got the garage to check out my car & trailer that afternoon. Another guy got his truck and followed me to the garage and gave the mechanic a report of what had been done. The garage had my car fixed by 6PM. The garage gave me a loaner car and allowed me to park the car/trailer on their lot overnight. Can you believe it?

After putting 4700 miles on my car, Bandit & I are safely home. No long trips for a while.

Several years ago a Board Member for my place of employment was riding in the car with me. She told me she could see Angels surrounding me. I have often thought of that conversation. What do you think? Was I blessed with Angels surrounding me on the trip?

Animals 4 God would like to know how many of you have chosen the names you call your pets? Of all the dogs Scott and I have parented, we have only chosen their names twice. And we have parented a lot of dogs! Granted, we could have renamed our dogs once we adopted them, but we always felt our dogs were already familiar with their names, and we didn't want to cause them additional stress by making them learn a new name.

"Canines who know their name will be more attentive. They will learn commands and recall, helping them understand what is expected of them. This leads to better and stronger bonds between dogs and their owners" (O'Connell, Liz). There are many (thousands) of names we can call our pets, and *TrustedHousesitters*, based on 100,000 pet names, issued a list of the most-popular pet names in the United States for 2025.

In the number one (1) spot for both cats and dogs is **Luna**. The next four (4) spots are **Bella**, **Lucy**, **Charlie**, **and Daisy**. This was the same order in 2024, also.

Here are the five (5) most popular pets names, according to the American Kennel Club:

In contrast are the names pet parents used in the 15th century. There was a book written then that listed 1,000 common pet names. Some of these names were – **Garlic, Mustard, Bryan, Dreadful, and Synful**. I can't imagine the reason these names were chosen.

In an article in *Psychology Today* (2011, May 23), called *What Not to Name a Dog*", it was said that we should seriously consider our pets personality when choosing a name. There are some universal rules drawing from common sense we should use when choosing a name for our pet.

For instance, if you choose the name "**Dog**" for your pet, it is as if that pet is extremely ordinary. Other names that are used are **Puppy**, **Mongrel**, **and Little Dog**. These names do not serve as a "strong start to the dog-human relationship. These canines are individuals, like humans, with different personalities, looks and behaviors, who deserve unique names" (O'Connell, Liz). AKC

The youth would like to again thank all who supported us on It's Their Mission this year. Our Shareholder Report is on the board in the hallway for anyone who would like to read the full report. Some highlights are that our team this year consisted of 25 youth and 15 adults. The cost of the entire trip was \$10,592.25, which averages to \$264.81 per person, which includes a \$500 donation to Border Church. Our work-related expenses were unusually low due to the Hope Crisis Response Network (HCRN) providing most of our supplies, while we provided the labor.


