



## HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2025

2025 was filled with wonderful opportunities for ministry and fellowship. It seemed to have gone by in a blink of an eye. I am excited to share some highlights from the past year with you!

The Lutheran Mission of Puerto Rico missionary team expanded this past year with the addition of Vicar Paul Mroczenski and his family arriving in March and Alliance Missionary Sergio Maita and his family arriving in July. We now have a team of 9 missionaries plus families sharing the Gospel, planting Lutheran churches and showing mercy in Puerto Rico.



At the end of March, with the guidance and help of Deaconess Christel Neuendorf, we taught a workshop on Altar Care and what it means to be part of an Altar Guild. It was a combined event between Iglesia Luterana Príncipe de Paz (Mayaguez) and Iglesia Luterana Fuente de Vida (Ponce). We started with the history of the church gathering as a group of people, to the order of the services, talking about the the history of the lectionaries and the liturgy and then all that follows, like the paraments, Holy Communion ware, banners, etc. It was a very full day that ended with two congregations making banners together and creating Altar Guild teams to prepare and maintain the altars in their own congregations. It was a wonderful opportunity to take what I am learning in Deaconess classes and teach the congregations here in Puerto Rico.

One of my big focuses this year was teaching bible studies to children. I started teaching Sunday School for the children at Iglesia Luterana Príncipe de Paz (Mayaguez). This year we learned about the Gospel readings that follow the one-year lectionary. The children heard about the readings in the Divine Service, and we did activities and crafts in class to help understand the readings better. During the week, the kids would constantly ask me what we were going to be doing on Sunday. It was a joy to see them so excited to learn about the stories of the Bible.



I continued teaching and organizing the Latin America and Caribbean region's missionary girl's Bible study, named "Beautiful Inheritance" (Psalm 16). This bible study meets once a month on zoom and includes girls ages 8-14 serving in 5 different countries. This year we studied the names of God in the Old Testament. I look forward to more opportunities in 2026 to lead and grow in my abilities to teach bible studies.



The mission was blessed this year with many short-term teams of volunteers. In the month of January, we had a team from Minnesota. In May we had a group of music students and leaders from Concordia University Nebraska (CUNE). In June we had an individual Abby, shadow Deaconess Christel and Missionary Ruth. And in October we had a group from Texas. These faithful individuals and groups help provide support, services, and encouragement for the mission in Puerto Rico.



On Pentecost Sunday, Iglesia Luterana Cordero de Dios, the congregation in the San Juan Metro Area (Bayamon) welcomed five new members into their congregation through confirmation.

After months of catechesis the congregation was able to rejoice in hearing these new members confess their faith publicly, and to see the joy and peace that they have in knowing that they have forgiveness, life, and salvation in the name of Jesus. The new members are all very excited to share to share with everyone the reason for the hope the Lord has placed in their lives. With the help of the Lord, we look forward to many more confirmations to come

Since September, Pastor Gustavo Maita and I have been meeting monthly with a group of young adults and several church members on the west coast of the Island for bible study and fun activities such as bowling and roller skating. This group is a wonderful opportunity for our congregations because many young adults in Puerto Rico feel disillusioned by church experiences they have had in the past which focused mainly on rules and pressure. Through these young adult gatherings, they are hearing the distinction between the Law and the Gospel, sometimes for the first time. Friends who weren't planning to listen have found themselves introduced to the Good News of Christ's free gift for sinners.



October 2025 marked our second "All Church" or "National" Assembly. This is a time when all three congregations gather in the Word, fellowship, and the business of the church. This year it also coincided with our Fall Foro and a Short-Term Team from St. Paul, Austin, TX! It was an awesome time spent together celebrating the Reformation, learning and growing with one another, and ultimately receiving Christ's gifts together as one church body.

I spent the last half of November and first part of December in the Dominican Republic assisting our Human Care Missionary team with the on boarding of two new missionaries. While I was there, I had the opportunity to participate in their advent activities and enjoy fellowship with my missionary friends that live there.
