



A Note About This Morning's Worship

The Service for Palm/Passion Sunday embodies the necessary tension that exists between the joyful entry of the palm processional and the somberness of the week of the Passion.

Why do we combine the palms and the Passion? It is in accord with the historical tradition of the Christian Church. Since at least the 4th century, the focus of the first day of Holy Week has been the passion of Christ. After a joyous procession of palms, the story of the Passion has been read aloud. Meditation on the cross of Christ is a necessary prelude to the joyful celebration of Easter Sunday.

As we conclude our Lenten preparation for the glory of Christ's resurrection, let us remember the whole story – the triumph and the tragedy, the darkness and the light.

Easter Sunday - One Great Hour of Sharing

Since 1949 Presbyterian churches world-wide have made Easter contributions to One Great Hour of Sharing, a program supporting disaster assistance for those who have suffered from natural and man-made disasters and for those who suffer from hunger worldwide. The funds are also used to provide education and to coordinate experiences that will lead to financial independence. Those at FPC who wish to contribute may find a "One Great Hour of Sharing" envelope on the tables at the back of the sanctuary on March 24 and on March 31 and may place the envelope and donation in the collection plate.

The flowering of the cross represents the transition from Good Friday to Easter, from meditation on Jesus' death to joyful celebration of His resurrection. The ceremony transforms a barren cross, a reminder of Jesus' death, into an Easter symbol, so please feel free to bring flowers for flowering the cross on Easter Sunday. This will be done at the 8:30 and 11:00 services.
