




#### John 10:22-30

<sup>22</sup> At that time the Festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, <sup>23</sup> and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. <sup>24</sup> **So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long** will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." <sup>25</sup> **Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me,** <sup>26</sup> but you do not believe because you do not belong to my sheep. <sup>27</sup> My sheep hear my voice. Reverend Saathoff and the FPC Worship Committee invite you to commemorate this great day in church history by wearing red as we gather on Pentecost Sunday, June 8, for Bible study and worship.





### Capital Campaign Update

Our FPC Capital Campaign is progressing well, and we are moving quickly to our Celebration Sunday on May 18, 2025! For those of you who have not taken the opportunity to return your commitment cards with your



three-year pledge, we humbly request that you prayerfully complete the pledge card and return it to the church by May 11. We want your contribution to be included in total funds committed to reducing our indebtedness over the next three years! If you think your gift would have little to no impact on our debt reduction, then think again! Consider this:

A \$50/per month commitment equals a total commitment of \$1,800.

What if 10 people/households made the same commitment? That level of giving equals \$18,000!

What if 20 people/households made the same commitment? That level of giving equals \$36,000!

These examples demonstrate the power and impact of the community of faith striving together to expand our capacity of ministry and missions.
