

Isaiah 35:1-10

- ¹ The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus ² it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and shouting. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.
- ³ Strengthen the weak hands and make firm the feeble knees. ⁴ Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you."
- ⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be opened; ⁶ then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert; ⁷ the burning sand shall become a pool and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp; the grass shall become reeds and rushes.
- ⁸ A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people; no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray. ⁹ No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. ¹⁰ And the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Stock Donation to FPC

REMINDER! For those of you who are considering donating stock to the church, or making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly from your IRA to the church for the calendar year 2025, this memo is to remind you that the transaction must be completed by 12/31/2025 if you want the contribution to be a tax deduction for 2025. However, please try to complete transactions before the last week in December to avoid a last minute "glitch" that may keep you from being eligible for a 2025 tax deduction. Yvonne Rose has paperwork in the church office that facilitates the stock donation process, so please feel free to contact Yvonne if you wish to donate stock.

Also, for those who intend to pre-pay their pledge for 2026 in the calendar year 2025, please note that this should be completed before the last week in December as mentioned above.

Stewardship Campaign Update

The Stewardship Campaign for 2026 pledges is progressing well. To date, we have received 78 pledges for approximately \$550,780. This puts us almost 85% of the way towards our goal. There are still 26 individuals who pledged in 2025 that have not, as of yet, committed to pledging for 2026. If you have already pledged to give for the 2026 Budget, thank you for your very generous support. If you plan to pledge, but just haven't gotten around to it yet, PLEASE do so in the near future. Either put your completed card in the collection plate this Sunday or drop it by the church office at your earliest convenience. If we are to balance the budget in 2026, we need everyone's financial support. Remember that no pledge is too small. If we all pull together, we can achieve our goal.
