

## Scripture Reading:

Matthew 22:23-33


<sup>23</sup> On that day some Sadducees (who say there is no resurrection) came to Jesus and questioned Him, <sup>24</sup> **saying, "Teacher, Moses said, 'If a** man dies having no children, his brother as next of kin shall marry his wife, and raise up **children for his brother.'** <sup>25</sup> Now there were seven brothers among us; and the first married and died, and having no children, he left his wife to his brother. <sup>26</sup> It was the same also with the second brother, and the third, down to the seventh. <sup>27</sup> Last of all, the woman died. <sup>28</sup> In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife of the seven will she be? For they all had her **in marriage."** 

<sup>29</sup> But Jesus answered and said to them, "You are mistaken, since you do not understand the Scriptures nor the power of God. <sup>30</sup> For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. <sup>31</sup> But regarding the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was spoken to you by God: <sup>32</sup> 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is not the God of the dead, but of the living." <sup>33</sup> When the crowds heard this, they were astonished at His teaching.

<sup>31</sup> Now He took the twelve aside and said to them, **"Behold,** we are going up to Jerusalem, and all the things that have been written through the prophets about the Son of Man will be accomplished. <sup>32</sup> For He will be handed over to the Gentiles, and will be ridiculed, and abused, and spit upon, <sup>33</sup> and after they have flogged Him, they will kill Him; and on the third **day He will rise."** <sup>34</sup> The disciples understood none of these things, and the meaning of this statement was hidden from them, and they did not comprehend the things that were said.

## Attention: Online Giving

This is a reminder that the church has now changed our on-line giving provider from Acceptiva to Subsplash. We did this for two reasons: (1) cost - individual transaction costs have been reduced by ~37% and (2) flexibility – you can now give using your smart electronic devices in addition to using the link on the website.

There is one difference with Subsplash that needs clarifying. Subsplash takes out their fee out prior to sending the money to the church, whereas Acceptiva sent the gross amount and then charged the church. Thus, whether you opt to pay the fee or not, the church receives the net amount of your gift after the fee is subtracted. For example, if you gifted the church \$100 and the fee was 2.5%, the church would receive \$97.50 if you opted not to pay the fee and \$100.00 if you did opt to fund the fee. While we very much appreciate all those who choose to pay the fee, it is entirely the choice of the donor. The important thing to remember is that you will get credit on your giving statement for every single penny that you donate. So the person who donated \$100 without paying the fee will get credit for \$100, and the person who opted to pay the fee will get credit for \$102.50.

Finally, there are still a few people who are giving on a recurring basis through Acceptiva. We plan to completely phase out Acceptiva by February 15, so we need those that are giving through Acceptiva to switch over to Subsplash as soon as possible. 
