A WORD FROM PASTOR BEN:

“Sin that Leads to Death” Series, Part 2

In our last newsletter, we introduced our subject for this series and established a thesis on what we are examining. We established our goal is to prove that the sin (ἁμαρτία | hamartia) that leads to death (θάνατος | thanatos) is a spiritual death resulting from the rejection of the Holy Spirit’s testimony (μαρτυρέω | martureō) concerning Jesus Christ that results in the blasphemy of the Holy Spirit, apos-tasy, and willful sin in the unregenerate secessionists. In this month’s newsletter, I provide a brief context for 1 John, focusing on 1 John 3:23. Through this verse, we gain insight into the overarching theme of 1 John, which aids in interpreting correctly the sin that leads to death.

Using 1 John 3:23 to Understand the Context of the Sin that Leads to Death

Because 1 John is a letter, understanding the letter’s purpose is a crucial element in interpreting the sin that leads to death. To answer the purpose of the letter of 1 John, one needs to look at 1 John 3:23. In John’s letter, he is writing to a beloved congregation. He is writing to encourage them to have a correct belief in Jesus and a genuine love for others. Howard Marshall defends this understanding, stating, “Belief and love go together, and that neither is sufficient without the other.” Also, Kruse provides helpful insight into the message of 1 John 3:23, stating, “There can be no obedience to God’s commands if there is no love for one another, there can be no love for one another if people close their hearts to those in need, and there can be no confidence when approaching God in prayer if people close their hearts to fellow believers in need.” It should also be noted that 1 John 3:23 serves not only as a transitional verse to the rest of the letter but also as the context in which the rest of the letter should be understood. Essentially, this passage serves as a summary of what came prior and an

introduction to what comes next. Marshall adds that John stresses to the readers that they are to believe in the name of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, a point that is demanded by the situation in which false beliefs about Jesus were prevalent. Another consideration is the use of the two Greek verbs πιστεύσωμεν and ἀγαπῶμεν. Both are part of a comprehensive command,” according to Akin. He explains, “Fundamentally, there is only one comprehensive command conveyed in a dual form: an explicit belief in the Son, Jesus Christ, and an active love for one another. The two parallel verbs “believe” (pisteusōmen) and “love” (agapōmen) work together to form one primary command.” Warren Wiersbe agrees with Akin’s assessment and states, “Faith toward God and love toward men are two sides of the same coin.” Furthermore, Bruce Smilie claims in his dissertation that “John’s intention in writing 1 John was to urge his readers to abide in Christ, so that they could ‘overcome’ the sinful world and its various temptations in their Christian experience.” John’s theological and applied theological understanding of what it means to be a child of God, along with his purpose of writing the letter, is communicated in 1 John 3:23. It provides a clear understanding of sound doctrine and good morality. Furthermore, it serves as the context in which John writes the entire letter, providing insight into understanding the textual meaning of the possible interpretations of the sin that leads to death.
