

The GCC Volunteer A/V Team exists to glorify God and make Jesus known by providing audio and visual support during Sunday morning corporate worship gatherings. The team consists of operators with varying knowledge and experience in audio engineering, sound equipment, networking, presentation, production, and video.

Special Events

For events that fall outside of Sunday morning worship gatherings, a Special Events AV Team has been formed with additional training and cross training and is available for hire at these events. This new standard eliminates pressure for Sunday morning-only members to regularly volunteer for events and spreads the workload out among appropriate individuals. Beginning in January 2023, ministries and ministry leaders should budget for their event's AV needs according to the tiered fee structure below. The fee structure is dependent on complexity, number of individuals needed, setup, and overall hours. The Director of Administration and Volunteer Director of AV will process the event's AV requests, including deciding on appropriate tiers and communicating and securing the Special Events AV team members.

Tier 1 Support (Audio only) - \$40

1 Team member; Light planning & setup; 1-3 Mics, Background music; 1-3 hour event

Tier 2 Support (Audio & Video) - \$75

• 1 Team member; Moderate planning & setup; Some programming; Multiple mics and instruments; Background music; 3+ hour event including setup, video presentation (stage hookup or booth presentation)

Tier 3 Support (Audio & Video) - \$150-225

2-3 Team members; Heavy planning, testing, & setup; Multiple mics and instruments; Background music;
4+ hour event including setup/testing; video production (may include livestream, recording, and/or custom camera setup); Presentation (stage or booth); Programming & software configuration

Other Events

Some small events may require very limited audio and do not fall under the Special Events Team support. Beginning in the Spring of 2023, training will be available to ministry leaders, and others, who can benefit from learning how to turn on and off the sound system, provide a microphone for speaking, and play background music.
