Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

For those yet to publicly confess Christ: Lord, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and trust you as my savior. Amen.

For those struggling against sin: Lord, grant that I may see in you the fulfillment of all my needs, and may turn from every false satisfaction. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely to me and run with perseverance the race that you have set before me, looking only to you, the pioneer and champion of my faith. Amen.

# Thoughtful Quote

#### Thomas Watson

Christ did not rise from the dead as a private person but as the public head of the church, and the head being raised, the rest of the body shall not always lie in the grave. Christ's rising is a pledge of our resurrection (2 Cor. 4:14).

## Next Week's Scripture Passage

1 Peter 3:18-22

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison, because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.

A daily discipline that we should all be engaging in is reading and studying the Scriptures. The Bible is the very Word of God. As the great Reformed Theologian Herman Bavinck once said, "In it (Scriptures) God daily comes to his people. In it he speaks to his people, not from afar but from nearby."
