Here's a peek at what your amazing kid learned this Sunday in KidZone. Use this guide to talk about it at home this week and grow in faith together!

🧠 Memorize Me:

"Your Word to me, Your servant, is like pure gold; I treasure what You say." — Psalm 119:140

💬 Need to Know:

God's Word is true.

🙌 Fantastic 5:

Here's a simple 5-point recap of this week's Bible story (Jeremiah 36; 2 Peter 1:21; 2 Timothy 3:16):

1. God gave Jeremiah a prophecy—a special message straight from Him—to share with the people of Judah.
 2. Jeremiah told his helper Baruch to write the message down on a scroll just as God had spoken it.
 3. Baruch read the scroll to the people, and the king eventually heard about it—but instead of listening, the king cut the scroll into pieces and burned it.
 4. Even though the scroll was destroyed, God told Jeremiah to write the same message again, showing that His Word cannot be stopped.
 5. In the New Testament, we learn that all Scripture is inspired by God and that prophecy comes when the Holy Spirit moves people to speak His truth.
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? Ask Me This!

(Perfect for the ride home, bedtime, or the dinner table Sunday)

1. Who gave Jeremiah the message he shared with the people?
 2. What did Baruch do with God's message?
 3. How did King Jehoiakim respond when he heard the scroll?
 4. What did God do after the scroll was burned?
 5. How does the New Testament teach us that prophecy comes from the Holy Spirit?
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Take Off! (Try this at home throughout the week!)

- **Tuesday:** Read Jeremiah 36:1–32 together and talk about how God gave Jeremiah His message for the people.
 - **Thursday:** Discuss why it's important to listen to God's Word and how His messages cannot be stopped.
 - **Saturday:** Make a "scroll" out of paper and write a favorite Bible verse on it. Display it somewhere you'll see it every day to remember God's truth.
 - **All Week:** Pray together, thanking God for His Word and asking the Holy Spirit to help your child understand it and live it out.
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Prayer Guide: God's Word is True

Opening:

"Dear God, thank You for giving us Your Word so we can know You and learn to follow You."

Thanksgiving:

"Thank You for giving Jeremiah Your message and for showing us that Your Word is always true, even when people don't listen."

Confession:

"Forgive us when we ignore or forget Your Word. Help us to listen and obey what You say."

Prayer for the Child:

"God, help [child's name] to love Your Word, understand it, and trust that it is always true."

Prayer for Strength & Guidance:

"Holy Spirit, guide [child's name] to live by the Bible every day and give them courage to follow You, even when it's hard."

Closing:

"Thank You, Lord, for giving us Your Word and for always keeping Your promises. Help our family to treasure and obey it. In Jesus' name, Amen."

Parent Challenge:

This week, talk with your child about a time they heard a message or instruction that was hard to follow but was the right thing to do. Compare it to how Jeremiah shared God's words with the people, even when it was difficult.

Read Jeremiah 36 together and discuss how God's Word cannot be stopped, even when people don't listen. Encourage your child to trust that God's Word is always true and to share what they learn from the Bible with others.

Pray together, asking God to help your family listen, obey, and trust His Word every day.
