
Your Kid's Weekly Faith Recap – Sunday Replay! Where we take what was learned in KidZone and bring it home! <u>This is Week 6 of our Better Than Gold series!</u>



Here's a peek at what your amazing kid learned this Sunday in KidZone. Use this guide to talk about it at home this week and grow in faith together!

Memorize Me:

Fantastic 5

Here's a simple 5-point recap of this week's Bible story (Mathew, Mark, Luke, and John):

- Jesus was born and lived a perfect life, showing God's love through His words and actions.
- 2. He taught people about God's kingdom, healed the sick, and performed miracles to show His power and compassion.
- Jesus was arrested, put on trial, and died on the cross to take the punishment for our sins.
- 4. Three days later, He rose from the dead, proving that He is God's Son and that He has power over sin and death.
- 5. Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, we can be forgiven, have eternal life, and live every day with hope in Him.

Ask Me This!

(Perfect for the ride home, bedtime, or the dinner table Sunday)

- 1. What kinds of things did Jesus do to show God's love while He was on earth?
- 2. Why did Jesus die on the cross?
- 3. What happened three days after Jesus died?
- 4. How does Jesus' resurrection prove that He is God's Son?
- 5. What does Jesus' life, death, and resurrection mean for us today?

Take Off! (Try this at home throughout the week!)

- Tuesday: Read part of Jesus' story from one of the Gospels (for example, Matthew 5:1–12 or John 6:1–14). Talk about how Jesus showed God's love.
- Thursday: Discuss why Jesus died on the cross and how His death shows God's forgiveness for our sins.
- Saturday: Celebrate the resurrection by baking "empty tomb rolls" (marshmallows wrapped in dough — when baked, the marshmallow disappears, leaving an empty "tomb"). Use this as a reminder that Jesus is alive!
- All Week: Pray together, thanking Jesus for His sacrifice and asking Him to help your family live with hope and share His love with others.

Prayer Guide: Jesus Gives Us Life

Opening:

"Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to show us Your love and to save us."

Thanksgiving:

"Thank You, Jesus, for living a perfect life, dying on the cross for our sins, and rising again so we can have hope and eternal life."

Confession:

"Forgive us when we forget what You've done for us or try to live life our own way."

Prayer for the Child:

"God, help [child's name] to trust in Jesus, believe in His death and resurrection, and follow Him every day."

Prayer for Strength & Guidance:

"Holy Spirit, remind [child's name] that Jesus is alive and give them courage to share His love with others."

Closing:

"Thank You, Lord, for the gift of salvation through Jesus. Help our family to live with joy and hope because He is alive. In Jesus' name, Amen."

▼ Parent Challenge

This week, talk with your child about what Jesus' life, death, and resurrection mean to you personally. Share a time when remembering that Jesus is alive gave you hope or helped you through something difficult.

Read a part of the resurrection story together (Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, or John 20) and discuss why it is the most important event in history. Remind your child that because Jesus is alive, we can have forgiveness, eternal life, and hope every day.

Pray as a family, thanking Jesus for His sacrifice and celebrating that He is risen!
