Cemetery Updates

The new cemetery (Springs Rd.) will have a new sidewalk leading to the columbarium from the drive poured in the next couple of weeks. The sidewalk is being poured to help assist those visiting the columbarium for various reasons.

Over the years the cemetery records (paper copies) have gotten weathered, torn, taped, and pretty much everything in between. In today's world of technology, several members of the cemetery committee have researched several companies to get our cemeteries on a digital data base. What benefits is there to going digital?

- We have accuracy of the plots and the names of those within the plots (GPS)
- Information will be available to the public (we have people calling asking if someone is buried in our cemetery)
- The data base will have pictures of the headstone
- All of the above and more will be available to you as a member online

The committee has met and contracted A Lazarus Cemetery Mapping to begin work as soon as the sidewalk to the columbarium is completed.

On January 1, 2026 cemetery plots will see an increase in price. The cost of a cemetery plot is for the perpetual care, long term maintenance of the grounds.

Church members - \$400

Non-Members who currently own a plot - \$1,300

What Has Changed Since 2005?



When I was installed as a pastor at St. Stephens in 2005, the congregation was actively developing plans for a major construction project. As the "new guy" it was exciting to be part of such a thriving congregation! I soon noticed, however, that there was a growing tension, especially in Congregational meetings. Ideas varied, of course, but the master plan called for building a very large Worship Center, with a seating capacity of up to 1200. That bold plan was technically approved in a rather raucous meeting, but the problem was obvious - the congregation was divided.

I believe that it is healthy for a congregation to have members with differing opinions, which is one reason we strongly advocate for our worship to have a variety of styles in order to reach more people, but relationships began to suffer when we lost focus on Jesus Christ (the very One whom we worship) as we sank into "worship wars". Since we were becoming more divided, we had a vital decision to

make about building - we chose to rebuild relationships out of Love for God and for one another.

As God worked through many faithful individuals and courageous leaders (along with the guidance of a group called Ambassadors of Reconciliation), the Lord began to draw us back together as the "Body of Christ". This required the confession of sins such as anger, idolatry, gossip and a lack of love, both among individuals and at times publicly, but by God's Grace, we forgave one another and many relationships were restored. We still have different opinions, but our culture has shifted to prioritize working together. Perhaps the best example of this change is our unique model of governance. When I arrived, we were ineffectively working under a policy-based model with a single board. This is very popular with businesses and nonprofits, and can work very well, but as I saw it, a large part of the conflict in our congregation centered around who could control that sole board. As we restructured, the congregation decided to include many more people in different, yet cooperative roles. Instead of a single Board, we now have a Board of Elders, a Board of Finance & Facilities, and a School Board, each with their own area of responsibility, yet also with a support for, and accountability to, one another. The leaders of those three Boards form a Council, along with our President and Vice-president. This Council serves the purpose of Coordination, Communication and Conciliation. Yes, this structure is a bit cumbersome as it requires a lot of effort, and sometimes even multiple levels of approval to get anything done. It is not efficient, but it has been effective at making us to work together.

With a healthier culture and a different model of governance all striving for unity, what else has changed at St. Stephens in the past 20 years? On the negative side, we have less people involved in worship than we did in 2005. As a single data point, that is concerning, but we actually have more people involved in small group ministry and Bible Study, which means that a higher percentage of our members are involved in the Word and Fellowship. Here's some more data for you. In the last 10 years, there has been considerable "turnover" in the congregation. We have received 528 members in the past decade, which includes 209 baptisms! Some of those have come and gone, but many have become vital servants and sharers of God's Grace. Also, part of the changing membership of our congregation are those whom the Lord has called to Glory. That number since 2015 includes just over 200 Saints of St. Stephens. They have received the Victory, but the Lord still has much for us to do in our ongoing mission of "Connecting People with Jesus".

So, 20 years later we are peacefully and cooperatively working together to build. There's the obvious construction of a Mission & Ministry Center which will serve church and school as a "Firm Foundation" for all that comes next as we serve the Lord and our community. But more than a physical structure, God is working in and through and among each of us to build up the Body of Christ so that we may bless generations to come with the Love of Jesus. That must never change. Thank God that He is not finished with us! To God be the Glory.






LWML invites you to get Connected
