TOKYO, JAPAN

INTERVIEW WITH PASTOR JASON SATO

Q: How did you meet God and know that you were called to be a pastor?

I was saved at the end of high school after some of my friends began inviting me to church. At first, I only went to the youth group's Friday night service so I could play video games with my friends beforehand. Honestly, I knew nothing about Christianity and didn't think very highly of Christians.

But my friends, the other kids in the youth group, and Pastor Sung (haha) consistently welcomed me and gave me space to learn and experience God. Even though I disagreed with a lot at first, the more I learned about Jesus, the more amazed I was that someone like Him could exist. He was so different from anyone or anything I had ever known.

In the middle of my senior year, during an evening service, I was singing and suddenly realized—I believed! In that moment, I had become a Christian without even knowing it. God is good.

My call to ministry came during an STM to OTR. I was given the chance to share a short teaching from the Bible, and afterward, my pastor, along with the OTR pastors and their wives, encouraged me to develop my teaching gift. Pastor Johann simply said, "So you're going to be a pastor..." and walked away (haha).

At the time, I had just enrolled in a graduate program without even praying about it, and I was also returning to church after a season away. That night, with a light schedule, I spent hours in prayer and experienced God's love and forgiveness in a powerful way. When I returned home, I talked with my pastor—and soon after, I enrolled in seminary.

Q: How did you meet Jessica?

We met at the college ministry that would eventually become Kairos.

Q: When did you join AMI?

We joined when Pastor Mark planted Kairos.



What has been happening recently?

This month we'll start a Saturday evening service called Oasis and next month we'll start alpha with Eunmi's friends. We'll also start doing outreach on a third campus and start a student meeting there.



What is the demographic?

We serve a wide range of people in our community, including families, single working adults, and college students.



What are the various ministries ?

We host bible studies, a seeker meeting, an English conversation club for university students, and holiday children's events. We also run a cultural exchange club that targets working adults and families.



How would you describe Japan's faith climate?

Japan is known to be a spiritually dry place. A friend describes it as being on a mountain where the air is thin. Tokyo in particular is spiritually noisy and there's a weariness that I think is largely spiritual. In the midst of this, there are many Japanese Christians fighting the good fight, faithfully loving people despite rejection and indifference. We clearly see God's steadfast love for the people here in many ways.

What are some ways you have witnessed God moving in Japan?

The ways that we have met people or been able to start ministries has been miraculous but the primary blessing has been to see our people changing. Almost all the people who join our Bible studies and Christian services had never been to church or even heard the gospel when we first met them. Initially, many were quite resistant to even talking about faith and God has given us the chance to see their hearts changing and developing real interest in knowing more about Jesus and faith. In June we hosted a retreat and 11 non-Christians joined us and we could see visible shifts in their attitudes and even their joy. Time and time again, we have seen God persistently pursuing people whether they are seeking Him or not.

Q: How can people support you?

The most important way you can support us is through prayer. The church has sent tens of thousands of missionaries and spent hundreds of millions of dollars on missions to Japan. People who are far smarter, more gifted, and better with language and culture than us have been laboring here for hundreds of years. God has to open the hearts of the people. Since we moved, we've invited people to sign up for 6 month commitments to pray for us weekly and we'd love to have more prayer support. We expect spiritual warfare to increase as God gives us new opportunities and we want to be able to focus on loving our people. A secondary way to help is to connect us to any Japanese people you know who live in the Tokyo region. A third would be to develop friendships with Japanese international students and immigrants in your communities. Usually the way into Japanese people's hearts is through Christian community.



MISSIONARY EUNMI JUN

INTERVIEW WITH MISSIONARY EUMMI JUN

Q: How did you meet God and know that you were called to be a missionary?

For many years, I struggled with hopelessness. After my mother passed away, I felt I had to do something, so I came to the United States hoping for change. But soon I realized that even here, I was still hopeless.

In that place of brokenness, God led me to a church where I encountered Him. For the first time, I realized that there might be hope in God. His grace transformed my life from hopelessness to a hope and joy I had never experienced until I met Him.

As I grew in faith and experienced healing, my passion to share this hope with others who feel there is none grew as well.

Q: When and how were you sent?

During discipleship training at Remnant Church in New York, God led the church leaders and me to pray and reflect on His calling for my life. After completing my nursing studies, by His grace, I was sent out as a missionary. In 2010, I was sent out to Shanghai.

Q: What kinds of ministry work are you engaged in?

I don't focus on just one specific ministry, but instead follow God's leading to meet the needs of each place He sends me. In Shanghai, I supported church members and shared the gospel. Now in Tokyo, as we prepare to plant a church, much of my time is spent building relationships and sharing God's love through everyday activities—whether it's cooking classes, Korean conversation clubs, or simple fellowship. My heart is to remain available to God's direction so that His love may be made known wherever I am.

Q: How can people support you?

Above all, what is most needed is prayer. Tokyo in particular feels like a place in deep need of spiritual prayer, and there are times when I myself feel weary. But we know that if God does not open the doors for the gospel, our efforts alone cannot accomplish anything. That is why we rely on prayer above everything else—for strength, for renewal, and for God’s Spirit to move powerfully in this city.

- Demographic Shift

The church is transitioning toward a local Taiwanese focus while maintaining bilingual accessibility. The congregation has shifted from a 50/50 Taiwanese-foreign mix to a majority Taiwanese, with an average age of 27.

- Prison Ministry

Serving in a 4,000-inmate international prison, the ministry sees 200 in regular attendance, requiring presentations in five languages. Many have been baptized, with about half of the attendees receiving baptism within prison walls. Communion is held consistently.

- Church Partnerships & Missions

Thrive has collaborated in multi-church STM efforts with Beijing New Life and Boston Symphony Churches, and is sending its first long-term missionary to Cambodia through an OMF partnership—a sign of growing missions maturity.

Post-Alpha Discipleship

- Following Alpha, 30 seekers are now part of Faith Exploration Family groups—the highest number of seekers in the church's history.

We had one sister who, after weeks of being piqued and seeking for answers, ended up at the English Camp, and through a series of conversations, one of our Tapestry sisters had the privilege of leading her in prayer to accept Jesus.

What were some of the team member's favorite memory?

We had a bonfire during English camp, and somehow, someone was able to convince the group to start dancing around it in circles. It was a hot and sweaty Vietnam evening, but joy and laughter overcame all discomfort. I remember seeing one of the more timid, shy girls trying to pull in her friend standing off to the side. The friend resisted at first but eventually gave in and joined the crowd. Seeing the shy girl take the initiative to invite her friend really impressed on me as I realized you can only invite another if you belong to something. I praised God for the belonging that comes from knowing him and being a part of his family, and I praised God for the invitations we get to extend from that place of belonging.

In what ways did the team witness God moving?

God moved in each aspect of the trip. Through VBS God touched the hearts of roughly 160 children (30 from Insan Permata and the rest from Fos Logos) and filled them with joy and praise. There was a unity in PRAISE that was so powerful and brought immediate spiritual connection between our team and the locals. We were able to witness the fruit of the ministry as we saw the children who grew up at Insan Permata now give back and serve so faithfully. Through the staff/teacher retreat, we saw God breaking strongholds in some of the teachers and God taking them through a process of healing. Through the parenting seminar, God equipped the parents with the foundational principles of Scripture and practical tools in understanding their role in developing the gifts and talents God has given their children.

A Team member's/ whole team's favorite memory?

Each one of our team members was touched personally by God and has their own stories to share. However, the one favorite memory that all of us share is the amount of passion the locals (adults and children alike) had for praise and worship. Although they seemed to be shy in general, they were not shy in their expression of worship. The joy of the Lord was evident throughout the STM trip.

In what ways did the team witness God moving?

Each day, we welcomed 60–80 children, with many returning and new faces joining. AMIIS students played and connected with local village children, which moved many of our staff and volunteers.

We were blessed by strong unity between Canvas and Renewal churches. Though we only trained virtually beforehand, meeting for the first time in Guatemala City felt seamless.

Overall, we were deeply encouraged to see how God is expanding His kingdom through AMI Cobán. Ministries at Iglesia La Gracia, AMIIS, and the missions center are creating genuine opportunities for people to experience Christ's love. Our team was especially inspired by the testimonies of Elder Kim and his wife, Pastor Moon, Pastor Katey, Katrina, Pastor Ferry, and other staff members.

What were some of the team member's favorite memory?

Over lunch, I spoke with Flavio, a young staff member who helps with translation and worship at Iglesia La Gracia. He first connected to AMI Cobán through a VBS led by an STM team seven years ago. Today, he is studying in seminary and hopes to become a youth pastor.

Later, on a house visit, we met a mother caring for her three children and disabled husband. We offered to bring her kids to VBS, and her oldest son, Eden, told us he wanted to be a pastor. At VBS, his joy was contagious—singing, playing, and laughing with other kids.

As I reflect on Flavio and Eden, I'm reminded that God is writing these stories. Seeds planted years ago are now bearing fruit, while new seeds are being sown. I'm grateful to witness these full-circle moments and continue to pray for both of them.

On July 5–12, a team from TBC traveled to Cincinnati, Ohio to serve at OTR Church. They organized a week-long sports camp that included Bible lessons, body worship, arts and crafts, and the children's choice of sport—basketball, soccer, or cheerleading. The team also engaged in street evangelism to reach out and share the gospel with the local community. In the evenings, they partnered with OTR Living Water to support both family game night and youth night.

In what ways did the team witness God moving?

It was encouraging to see how the Lord opened up the hearts of the kids and brought them into a posture of wholehearted body worship. At the start of the week, some of the older kids were acting "too cool" to participate in body worship. By the end, they were so excited for body worship, and those same kids were looking forward to coming up to the front to lead body worship with us.

It was also amazing to see how powerful the gospel is when we boldly proclaim and share with individuals during street evangelism. We had the opportunity to invite many people to church and lead many in a prayer of repentance and acceptance of Christ's forgiveness.

What was a favorite memory from the STM:

One highlight was when the TBC STM and OTW Living Water staff did the "Church Clap" dance in well-known public places throughout OTR—a joyful and memorable bonding experience.

Ministry Memory

BUSKING IN THE EVENING; ONE OF THE TWO LOCATIONS



What were some of the team member's favorite memory?

By the time the English Night started, there was only one guest in attendance, which was disappointing to us. About a third of the way in, a middle-aged man stopped and peered into the cafe, curious about what was going on. Seeing this, one of our team members (Anaïs) ran outside and invited him in. He stayed for the entirety of the evening conversing with those around him. We invited him to come to the concert on Saturday, unsure of whether he'd be interested but on Saturday, he was among the first to arrive! This was an encouragement to our team and to Anaïs in particular, who boldly stepped out to invite the man.

What type of STM did the team do?

We went to East Asia to support RCC & KM's music ministry. It was a two-team partnership: Symphony Church in Boston and Thrive Church in Taipei. From Symphony: Pastor Chan Park, Tim Wong, Anaïs Zhang, and Esther Tzau. Thrive Church had only one representative, and that was Jeremy Yeung, who actually is a former one-year missionary intern sent by Symphony to Taipei! So even though it was a two-church partnership, we all came together pretty easily and quickly.

Our primary responsibility was to support RCC in their music ministry. This consisted of busking, meeting with friends of RCC (both Christian and non-Christian) to form relationships by practicing music together and performing at a couple different events, including a coffeehouse English night and a larger-scale concert.

In what ways did you witness God moving?

At the concert, a brother from Chengdu shared his life story. It was essentially a personal testimony without explicit mention of Jesus or the Christian faith due to typical security reasons. It was a powerful testimony of how his life had been transformed and it was clear that God was moving through how people responded to the testimony. Many of those in attendance were moved even to the point of tears and one man, a non-Christian, asked in bewilderment after the concert, "How can someone endure such hardships and yet be so full of joy and peace?" Though we did not see anyone come to faith that evening, the right questions were being asked, relationships were being formed between non-Christians and members of RCC and we believe it was God who brought all of this together.

A team of 14 from Tapestry LA Church led an Encounter retreat for GCC members and partnered with the GCC staff to create a plan for the retreat to eventually be run independently.

This was the first time Tapestry LA collaborated with GCC Singapore to share Encounter retreat resources in a missional way. The team was surprised and grateful for how warmly the members—most of whom had never met them before—received their ministry. It was evident that the participants were deeply blessed, and the team witnessed powerful, tangible moments where God met and ministered to them.

What type of STM- what did the team do?

We are the iGHO medical mission team. Over three days, we held a clinic at Insan Permata Orphanage, providing medical care for the children, as well as for Fos Logos school students and teachers, church members, and neighbors in the surrounding community. Our services included medical and dental care, as well as distributing reading glasses and medications. We also conducted physical check-ups for the orphanage children to monitor their growth.



HEALINGS WITNESSED
