RCC CHURCH, EAST ASIA

A CHAT WITH PASTOR JC

How did you meet God and know that you were called to be a pastor?

I met God during my freshman year of college when I was evangelized by a senior. As I began attending a fellowship group regularly, I came to know God personally and experienced His presence in my life. By the end of that year, I was baptized and became a Christian.

In my second year of graduate school, I joined a short-term summer mission trip to the southwest region of China. The following year, I returned alone to the mountains and witnessed God's powerful work firsthand. The deep spiritual need I saw stirred my heart, and I felt a strong burden for more workers to join in the harvest. Through ongoing prayer and life experiences, God's calling became increasingly clear. Eventually, I responded by committing to serve Him full-time in ministry.

When did you join AMI?

I have been an active member of NLC since September 2011. In August 2017, I joined the NLC staff, serving and leading a student congregation. I was licensed in May 2022, and the following month, my wife and I began serving at RCC in a pastoral role. In May 2024, I was ordained as the pastor of RCC.



How did you meet your wife?

My wife and I met at NLC, where I had been attending for three years before she arrived. We served together on summer short-term mission trips and in the Alpha group, which gave us the opportunity to grow in faith and friendship. I deeply appreciated her heart and character and hoped for a committed relationship. We began dating on May 3, 2018, and got married on September 14, 2019. We are truly grateful to God for blessing us with such a wonderful family.



What has been happening recently at RCC?

Recently, we've been preparing for the upcoming summer short-term mission trip and music ministry in July. Through prayer, offerings, fundraising auctions, music rehearsals, outdoor performances, and camp planning, we are inviting more brothers and sisters to join in the work of God's kingdom. We also hope these efforts will help us connect with new friends whose hearts are already being prepared.

What is the demographic of RCC?

Currently, around 20 to 25 adult members attend our Sunday service. We have four families in the congregation, with a total of five children. Most of our single members are between 25 and 35 years old. We have more women than men in the group. Many members are recent graduates who have been working for two to three years. The most common profession is teaching, but others work as lawyers, dentists, engineers, marketers, and tour guides. A few members are working part-time or are currently unemployed.



What are the various ministries at RCC?

College Campus:

We are currently in the stage of preparation and prayer. A few students have shown interest, and we are focusing on building relationships and inviting them to participate in outreach activities.

Hospital Ministry:

We hold two activities each month. One involves preparing loving meals for families in the children's ward of the cancer hospital. The other includes organizing crafts, singing, and games for the children. These activities help us build deeper relationships with them. We hope to pray with them when the time is right and share the source of our comfort and hope.

Music Ministry:

Through rehearsals for music programs, we are connecting with other musicians who enjoy performing. During music sharing sessions, we hope hearts will be touched and prepared to receive more. These times allow us to make new friends and share our personal testimonies.

Summer Short-term Mission Trip:

This summer, we will serve Tibetan teenagers through academic tutoring and youth camps. We will also visit local families to learn more about their lives and culture, while participating in the work of sowing the seeds of the Gospel. Please pray that the long-standing power of idols may be broken.



How would you describe East Asia's faith climate?

In recent months, the faith climate in East Asia has been growing stronger and more encouraging. Through weekly evangelistic gatherings, prayer support partners, and discussion and sharing groups, people are building their faith on the foundation of truth. Their understanding and experience of God is deepening, and relationships within the community are becoming more genuine. More individuals are expressing a desire to grow spiritually and a willingness to serve.



What are some ways you have witnessed God moving in East Asia?

In small groups, on campus, in hospitals, and through music ministry, God has given us opportunities to serve and share our testimonies with new friends. Many people have open and receptive hearts eager to connect with us and seek the deeper meaning of life.

Some brothers and sisters are facing physical challenges such as cancer, severe insomnia, and mental health struggles. At times, there is intense spiritual warfare, leaving some feeling discouraged or spiritually burdened. Yet through these trials, we are learning to rely on God more deeply. His power and presence continue to be revealed and lifted high.

MISSIONARY KATE MOON

A CHAT WITH MISSIONARY KATE MOON

How did you meet God and know that you were called to be a missionary?

I remember hearing and accepting the gospel when I was five at the Wednesday chapel of a Christian school, but it wasn't until the summer after my sophomore year of college, on my first short-term mission trip, that I encountered God as an adult and that my faith became more solidified. After that summer, for several years, every major revelation I had about God occurred while I was on a mission trip. I eventually came to the conclusion that if the "mission field" was where I heard most clearly from God, where he felt most real, where I felt closest to him, why wouldn't I just always want to live there?

Though all believers are called to be missional in the way they live out their lives, my specific calling to share the gospel cross-culturally to people who have never heard it before came through increased exposure on short-term trips, at Friday night church meetings, and during a year spent in Micronesia when I realized that the things I was most excited and passionate about (learning about other cultures, acquiring proficiency in languages and bringing the gospel to people who have never heard) all lined up in the vocation of "missionary." The choice to spend the rest of my life doing these things felt natural and right. Now, almost thirty years later, I am still happiest when I am doing these things. When I am a missionary, I feel a keenly rewarding sense that I am fulfilling the purpose for which he created and placed me on this earth.

When and how were you sent?

I was sent in August 2002 by The Remnant Church (NYC). At the time, I was the missionary of this particular local congregation and thought of myself as a family member that they were sending out as an international extension of their ministry. As I still had a lot to learn, I was initially sent to be trained under a missionary couple who had already been in the country for many years. Two years later, AMI had been formed, and partnership with the AMI community of churches toward the goal of church-planting began.

HOW IS GOD MOVING?



What kinds of ministry work are you engaged in?

Currently, I am full-time student in seminary, so my main responsibility is to study and equip myself to be of better service to others. Ministries I have had the joy to participate in on a smaller scale over the past year have included: informal mentoring of younger believers, leading a small group exploring campus ministry possibilities, being part of a translation team for a book (exploring possibilities for establishing a business) and gathering musicians to form an outreach community – i.e., a group made up of both believers and those on the way where people can form genuine friendships and meaningful sharing can take place.

What are some ways you have witnessed God moving in East Asia?

In the first two years, while I was still learning the language, I had the chance to tag along with small itinerant ministry teams during my summer and winter breaks. Because they served many different types of groups, during this time, I got to see God working in some unusual ways, including a time of worship where orderly holy laughter rolled through a congregation in waves; there was also a group who seemingly regularly had messages team-preached through tongues with translation.

I was also blessed by the dedication of these workers as one team leader, perhaps six to seven months pregnant at the time, stood on her feet all day to preach and teach with passion. As they gathered with other teams to report on what God had done, one team expressed regret that they hadn't been able to do as much ministry this time because they had spent about a week in jail, and the other teams spoke up to encourage and comfort them.

Another testimony of God's goodness...

The police officer who attended our last music event at one point was moved to the point of tears (which someone close to him said they had never seen him shed before). Something that was shared caused him to reflect on his relationship with his mother, and after the event, they had a long talk and some intergenerational reconciliation took place

Malachi 4:6 (NIV):

"He will turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and the hearts of the children to their parents; or else I will come and strike the land with total destruction."



What has been happening recently in East Asia?

About eight to ten months ago, God spoke to me about the unwavering commitment of a parent's heart through a current ad for a missing child who had disappeared over 25 years ago. A few months later, I came to know someone who had been kidnapped at the age of six and sold to someone with an illness who needed some daily help. The child was mistreated and after several attempts successfully ran away, but unable to find their way home, they ended up living on the streets. One day, at the age of thirteen and lying down on the grass in a park, they looked up at the blue sky and said, "God, if you exist . . .," asking to be rescued from their current life. A few moments later, a passerby asked the child for directions, struck up a conversation and gave the child a card with the address of a place where they could live and even be sent to school. It sounded too good to be true, but the child reasoned, "If it's a scam, I can always just run away again," and decided to go check it out.

It turned out to be a home established by a missionary couple with a heart to bring children off the streets. Their ministry eventually helped at least a hundred, if not hundreds of children; this person was somewhere between the 10th and 20th child they had helped.

The person is now a disciple-making believer, and the most amazing part to me about this whole story is the way it was told, without a hint of self-pity. It was clear that they had made peace with their past and genuinely been made whole by the Lord.

I believe the reason they chose to share their story with me—saying I was only the third person in the city they had ever told—was because they had attended one of our musician exchange events, where I shared about wanting to translate a song that uses the metaphor of a missing child. This was the same song God led me to through the missing child ad, which was connected to the artist who wrote it.

About a month ago, the translation was completed and the song was performed at our spring outreach. Afterward, the individual, who was in attendance, shared that they felt God was prompting them to share their story with more people. They even asked if they could share it at our next outreach event.

If we are able to faithfully steward this special gift and opportunity that God has given us, I believe we will witness Him doing great things.

- For unity in heart, love and mutual respect among the various groups of believers (from different AMI churches as well as different churches in this city) coming together to do his kingdom work here this summer.
- God's provision and direction in choosing an office space (location) which can be used for musician/artist exchanges and other kinds of outreach activities. We are looking to move in early to mid-August.
- For clear leading regarding college ministry for Fall 2025.



How can people support you?

Besides what many are already doing through praying with their AMI communities and through newsletters like this one, three ways come to mind:

3) If musicians and/or artists would like to visit to be a part of a musicians' exchange, they are more than welcome. This visit could happen in the fall, spring or summer.

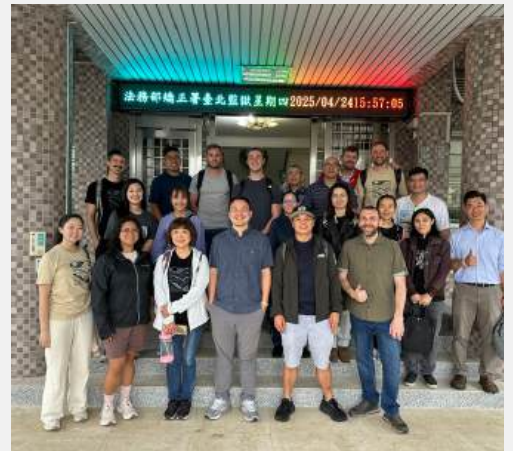

In what ways did the team witness God moving?

I was encouraged by the faithfulness of the STM and Thrive Church teams to God's work despite many difficult situations. We had people come to the events who we might have never met unless we went out to evangelize or posted on social media. During the evangelism sessions, many members had good conversations about faith with students and strangers. Although it may not seem like a lot of fruit came out of it or the gospel was received, it was encouraging to see everyone step out in faith. Truly God gives growth!

Team member: We could see God softening the hearts of Taiwanese people. That isn't to say that everyone was receptive. But I think it was seeing the contrast of responses to similar kinds of questions or conversations that highlights that it isn't really about what we say but about the hearts that God is softening. It was really cool to see that one of the students we encountered while outreaching on NTUST (National Taiwan University of Science and Technology) came to one of Thrive's events.

What was a favorite memory from the STM:

One memory that we really enjoyed was the last night before departing. At the end of the mission trip, the Thrive team took us to the night market. We were able to get to know the Thrive church members better as well as have fellowship with each other. Afterwards, some of us decided to go on a spontaneous hike up elephant mountain (a popular hike with good views of Taipei). A few of us decided to rent bikes to get there. One highlight was coincidentally running into another missions team at the base of the mountain that we had met earlier that day at Thrive's Sunday service. We did the hike together which allowed us to get to know a few of them better. Afterwards some of us were able to share about our faith with some workers at a massage store. These moments of the fellowship between churches and also still trying to reach out to those around us were really precious.

AWANA CAMP STM

COS ANAHEIM, JUNE 12-21, 2025

On June 12-21 a team from COS Anaheim traveled to Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC) and Pleiku in Gia Lai Province to serve at New Song Church and local churches through Awana ministry. The team consisted of Antonio Ko, John Nam, Kaleb Kim, Kara Chung, Kristy Goto, Lucas Cheng, Sammy Lee, Suyoung Min, and Yongman Hong, representing various churches. Throughout the trip, the team led Awana programs filled with worship, games, crafts, and gospel-centered lessons, sharing the love of Christ with children and teens in both urban and rural settings.

In what ways did the team witness God moving?

Pleiku is located in the rural Central Highlands, where the people are ethnically distinct from the majority Vietnamese population and primarily speak Jarai. We served the local churches by leading two Awana camps, joyfully praising God together through songs, body worship, crafts, games, activities, and gospel-centered lessons. Over 60 children and teens attended the first location, and more than 100 participated at the second—about 50% more than we had originally expected. We nearly had to cancel the second camp due to the sudden death of a young man in the community. However, through prayer and God's amazing grace, the church decided to move forward and welcomed our team to hold the Awana program as planned.



What was a favorite memory from the STM:

After completing the Awana program, the team continued to praise God with joyful hearts—regardless of the setting or circumstance. In a beautiful expression of worship, they took to the streets and even a local tea shop, performing body worship as a testimony of God's love and presence.





COBAN, GUATEMALA

STEM/SCIENCE CAMP STM

JUNE 21-28, 2025

A team from Church of Southland Anaheim traveled to Cobán, Guatemala to host a STEM Science Camp for local students. The camp featured hands-on activities designed to spark curiosity and creativity, including launching water bottle rockets, building and racing small cars, testing structures on a shaker table, and designing parachutes for an egg drop challenge. Through these engaging experiments, the team aimed to inspire a love for science while building meaningful connections with the students.

The team witnessed God moving in many meaningful ways throughout their time in Cobán. One clear example was when they prayed for the rain to stop during their STEM class time window from 2 to 5 p.m. —and it did, allowing the camp activities to continue without interruption. During house visits, the team had opportunities to pray for local families, offering encouragement and care. From June 23 to July 1, a team from Kairos Church—including Hiromi Fujita, Kirsten Kim, Sarah Bello, Trisha Tong, Riki Lee, and Joshua Kou (our 1-year intern)—traveled to Tokyo for a short-term mission. We partnered with the Tokyo team (Satos, Eunmi, Hannah, and Yeri) to support a Seeker Retreat held in Atami. The retreat brought together 10 non-believers, 1 new believer, a guest pastor (Seita), and members of both the Tokyo and Kairos teams. It was a powerful time of connection, sharing, and sowing seeds of faith in a relaxed and welcoming setting.

In what ways did the team witness God moving?

Trisha's response: I began to see that a lot of patience and faith were required to serve here, as many people are culturally more reserved and Christ is largely unknown in this country. I was encouraged by the Tokyo team's genuine obedience, longing, and care for the community they're building. Even though the changes in people's hearts may seem small in man's eyes, I witnessed how these small steps are God working in powerful ways. During the retreat there were many breakthroughs, some of which had been years in the making.

Riki's response: I witnessed God moving a lot through our team and how each team member was allowing the Spirit to move in how they served. A lot of patience and flexibility was shown in our team.

Hiromi noted: By the end of the weekend, there was great openness to the gospel. After Sunday worship, the Tokyo team prayed for each attendee, and follow-up has revealed encouraging signs—those once closed off are now asking questions, engaging with the gospel, and requesting books to learn more. God is clearly at work.
