# COVENANT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH MINUTES OF THE SESSION MEETING ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2025

## Call to Order and Opening Prayer

Bob Henderson, Moderator

The Moderator called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the community room of Roof Above's The Rise on Clanton. The Moderator offered words of welcome, opened in prayer, and offered a devotional.

# **Determination of Quorum and Review of Agenda**

The Moderator declared that a quorum was present and made a motion to adopt the meeting agenda and the Consent Agenda. The motion was approved on vote by the attendees.

## **Planning and Evaluation Report**

Kim Spivey, P&E Chair

Spivey noted that over the last 18 months, the Session has approved the creation of the new associate minister role, called for the formation of an APNC to call a candidate, and celebrated the installation of our new Associate Minister for Congregational Life. She noted that two pieces of business remained to stand up the new role and expanded ministry. First, to align the Session structure with the new staff and ministry structure. Second, to ensure start-up funding for the new areas of focus for Congregational Life.

Spivey made a recommendation which had been reviewed and endorsed by current ministry leadership. As worded, she brought a motion that Session approve a change to Session structure such that there is a Congregational Life ministry and a Congregational Care ministry and that Engagement becomes a committee of Congregational Life. After discussion, the motion was seconded and approved.

Spivey then noted that a provision of start-up funding was needed to support our focuses on racial equity and partnerships with local congregations. As worded, she made a motion that

Session approve a total expenditure of \$60,000 over three years from the Rosebro Fund to be directed to a designated Congregational Life fund with a funding schedule of \$10,000 for the remainder of 2025, \$30,000 for 2026 and \$20,000 for 2027. After discussion, the motion was seconded and approved.

## **Ministry Reports**

Congregational Life

Bill Saunders, Congregational Life Chair

Saunders commended the Session to review the array of good work happening in the church. Examples he noted included the TLC AI program at UNCC (9/24), 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter Panthers/Cowboys game (9/28), Health and Wellness blood drive (9/13). He discussed upcoming work to develop a Covenant cookbook. Finally, Saunders noted the strong involvement of many to conduct a successful fall kickoff on August 24.

Education

Sarah Wilson, Education Chair

Wilson shared an update on children and youth ministries. With gratitude, she shared that, due to Amber Brown's focus on recruiting for children's programs, there are now 12-16 volunteers per grade level. She also shared that Jordan Schriefer led an incubation team to drive volunteer support for the middle school and high school youth programs. A discernment dinner was held 8/20 which involved prayer stations, testimony from youth, parents and advisors. Wilson noted that many people stepped forward and committed to serve. Results have been positive and, at the Sep. 7 youth kickoff, there were 86 youth in attendance, with many volunteers of all ages showing up to support. Wilson noted appreciation for the numbers, but more for the spirit of generosity and energy God is stirring in the congregation. She then expressed appreciation to the Envision team and P&E for their vision, and the session for their support.

Mission & Outreach

Amanda Abrahm, Mission & Outreach Vice Chair

Abrahm highlighted a few expressions of the Mission and Outreach ministry. Bright Stars of Bethlehem will host a fundraising gala at Covenant on 9/13. Mitri Raheb of Bright Stars will speak as part of our three-part speaker series, "An Ethic of Peace in the Holy Land" the following morning (the 14<sup>th</sup>) at our services. On 9/21, Liz Clasen Kelly (CEO of Roof Above) will present a Minute for Ministry, and as part of that, Covenant will present to Roof Above a \$100K gift that will be accompanied by a commitment/goal of 100 volunteer hours at Roof Above during the month of October. Also on 9/21, Chef Johnny will hold a cooking class on how to make Texas Hash for Roof Above.

Abrahm noted that the Minute for Ministry on 9/28 will focus on the 1-year anniversary of Hurricane Helene. On 9/26, the Kenya team will depart on their mission trip. Abrahm shared that bracelets made during Covenant's Vacation Bible School will be given to students at the

Renguti School and Mountain Park Academy. Also, Mandy and team will soon be sending out letters with information on scholarships for Mountain Park Academy students. \$500 covers one student's yearly tuition at MPA. The goal is to fund about 60 sponsorships. Finally, she offered a reminder of Covenant Impacts Charlotte which will be the week of 11/10 – 11/16. Several partner meetings have already been held in preparation for this year's event.

Worship

Beth Koonce, Worship Committee Active Elder

Koonce highlighted some aspects worship life at Covenant: We have resumed 4 worship services. Dr. Mitri Raheb will speak as part of the Ethic of Peace series and then worship with us on September 14. October 5 we will observe Worldwide Communion Sunday. November 1 is All Saints Sunday and an opportunity for Elders to serve Extended Communion.

Koonce also commended Emily Floyd's excellent start in her first Sunday with Covenant.

## Clerk's Report

Janet Delery, Clerk of Session

Delery invited Assistant Clerk Philip James to present a motion to initiate the Committee On Assignments (COA) to match the 2026 Session with ministry leadership opportunities. James made the following motion: That the Session appoint the following members to the COA to fulfill the responsibilities outlined in Covenant's Operations Manual: Philip James, Alex Chinery, John Beyer, Vince DiSandro, Judy Emken, Jordan Schriefer, Anne Gildea, Amanda Abrahm, Lou Watson, Ben Unger, Bob Henderson (Staff Liaison). The motion was unanimously approved.

Delery noted that there is no Session meeting in October, to make way for the annual Elder Dinner.

# **Call to Order and Opening Prayer**

Monthly Financial Comments
September 2025

#### Income Statement Comments

The main impacts of the September Income Statement are outlined below.

**Income:** Pledge receipts were above budget by \$29K for the month and below budget \$34K YTD, On a YTD basis, pledge receipts are on track with the historical 3-year average (67% of budgeted pledge income received YTD). Total Income was above budget by \$24K for the month and above budget \$159K YTD, Christmas Eve contributions and CDC income continue to be significant drivers of the surplus.

**Expenses:** Total Expenses were below budget by \$57K for the month and are below budget \$224K YTD. The YTD variance to budget is primarily the result of several unfilled staff positions and timing of ministry expenses.

<u>The Bottom Line</u>: The Net Loss was \$56K for the month, above budget by \$80K, YTD Net Income is \$13K, above budget by \$383K, primarily driven by strong performance in Administration's incomegenerating ministries (schools, recreation, food service and facility rentals) and personnel expenses running below budget.

#### **Balance Sheet Comments**

Significant changes in the Balance Sheet for the month, as compared to the prior month, were:

Line 25: Reflects the month's net cash from operations.

Line 29 & 35: Reflects market value increases in Endowment funds.

Line 33: Reflects payments for Cornerstone Fund projects comprising Recreation Wing

equipment.

Line 36: Increase reflects receipt of donations, partially offset by pastoral care,

education, campus repairs, and CDC Financial Assistance expenses.

Line 39: Reflects the month's operating Net Loss.

#### Income Statement Comments

The main impacts of the October Income Statement are outlined below.

<u>Income</u>: Pledge receipts were above budget by \$19K for the month and below budget \$15K YTD. Total Income was above budget by \$16K for the month and above budget \$175K YTD.

**Expenses:** Total Expenses were below budget by \$59K for the month and are below budget \$284K YTD. The YTD variance to budget is primarily the result of several unfilled staff positions and timing of ministry expenses.

**The Bottom Line:** The Net Loss was \$24K for the month, above budget by \$76K. YTD Net Loss is \$11K, above budget by \$459K, primarily driven by strong performance in Administration's incomegenerating ministries (schools, recreation, food service and facility rentals) and personnel expenses running below budget.

#### **Balance Sheet Comments**

Significant changes in the Balance Sheet for the month, as compared to the prior month, were:

Line 25: Reflects the month's net cash from operations.

Line 29 & 35: Reflects market value increases in Endowment funds.

Line 33: Reflects Cornerstone Fund project maintenance transfer (credit), partially

offset by debits for organ repairs, kitchen equipment, and Recreation Wing

equipment.

Line 36: Decrease reflects receipt of donations, offset by pastoral care, education,

and CDC Financial Assistance expenses, and transfer of project maintenance

allocation to Comerstone Fund.

Line 39: Reflects the month's operating Net Loss.
