A MESSAGE FROM PERRIN

I was once told that upon their election, both Pope John Paul I and Pope Francis remarked to the cardinals who elected them, “May God forgive you for what you have done.” The disarming comment brought a touch of humor to an obviously weighty decision. The two men understood the magnitude of the title. While far from the papacy, I share the sentiment of that jest with you as I take ordination vows today.

This community—those gathered here and many who are not present—has played a role in leading me to this day. You were patient with me as I discerned my place in ministry, showed me grace as I grew and changed, and affirmed that, despite my own efforts, the Spirit is indeed at work. I am deeply grateful for our shared experiences and for the ways they have shaped my understanding of God’s active presence in the world.

While this moment is a milestone that can feel like the finale of a long journey, I pray that it is instead the beginning of our next season of faith seeking understanding. As God prepares the great feast and gathers a people devoted to shared life, prayer, and the breaking of bread, may we take our place at the table together—trusting that the One who hosts us is still forming us.
