

# The Five Pillars of Family Discipleship

Each pillar strengthens our family's faith journey.

- Bible Reading builds knowledge and understanding of God. 2 Peter 1:3
- Prayer fosters a deep connection with God. Matthew 6:5-8
- Missions encourages serving others in need. Matthew 25:36-40
- Evangelism shares our faith with the world. *Romans 10:14-15*
- Fellowship creates lasting bonds within the community. *Hebrews 10:24-25*

It usually involves learning a language or learning new cultural things where there is no church in which people are doing evangelism of those in that culture. They don't have any access to the gospel or they do but noone is speaking it to them.



We must set aside <u>TIME</u> to invest spiritually into our life and our family's life.



#### All in a Day's Discipleship




How do Christians think about stewarding their time toward spiritual growth?
