I've learned, like Job, that sometimes we don't get the answers we desire. Instead, we are empowered to remain faithful, to keep walking with Christ in obedience, and our God, who is greater than we understand, will be with us. Thank you for being the Church and continuing to be there for me and each other through the hard times and the great ones.
