














Finding Peace in a Season of Troubles

Shirley Egbert Olenik's life journey has taken her far and wide—from her birthplace of Mount Holly, New Jersey, to Youngstown, Ohio, then to Virginia's Eastern Shore in 1999, and finally to Texas in 2015. In August 2020, she made Scenic Hills in Schertz her home.

A life member of VFW Post 8315 and the Schertz Cibolo Auxiliary, Shirley has always been drawn to service. She is a retired long-term care nurse and a former member and treasurer of the Canyon Lake Pilot Club, a women's group dedicated to helping brain-injured children and adults. Her passions include cooking, baking, reading, camping, traveling, and music—especially piano music and anything she can sing along with.



Shirley's greatest joy is living out her faith by being the hands and feet of Christ wherever she goes—whether with her three children, five grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, friends, or the elderly. She credits her mother and stepfather as her greatest role models. Her mother was an active church volunteer, famous for her pies at bake sales, and her stepfather served for 50 years as an ambulance driver with the Snow Hill, Maryland Volunteer Fire Department.

During her nursing career, Shirley often worked the afternoon shift, giving her the opportunity to offer patients not only their evening medication but also a warm hug or kiss —reminding them they were loved.

Though she was married for 46 years to a Ukrainian-American and was part of the Ukrainian Byzantine Catholic Church, Shirley's Methodist roots run deep. Her paternal great-great-great-grandfather founded Egbert Methodist Church in Tiffin, Ohio, nearly 201 years ago. She was honored to participate in the church's 200th anniversary last year by singing "It Is Well With My Soul."

Shirley began attending Schertz UMC on Palm Sunday 2022, quickly joined the choir, and soon after became a member. Today she leads our visitation ministry, Gabriel's Angels, and is a faithful member of the Rainbow Sunday School class. We are grateful for Shirley's joyful heart, servant spirit, and the way she lives her faith every day.

One of the main activities was a CPR class taught by Todd. He taught the children using dolls, which quickly became a highlight. The young girls were especially captivated by them, and their fascination with the dolls revealed a new ministry opportunity for future trips.

Meanwhile, Derek and Brian worked with two of the older boys to repair the orphanage's exterior lighting system. This unplanned project, which came about at the boys' request, was a great way to bond while helping with a practical need.

The team focused on building personal relationships as well. Heather spent a lot of time nurturing an infant and connecting with many of the kids. Barbara worked with a group of children on a puzzle, and as they played, she was able to develop meaningful relationships. Alicia, known as Weezy, served as an interpreter for the CPR class and other communications. The children quickly warmed up to her, seeing her as an easy and approachable connection to our group.





Brian and another member of the team also visited a smaller, nearby orphanage to deliver a donation of adult diapers. Later, our team was joined by members from Alamo Heights and Universal City UMCs. Together, we played a language game similar to charades. Each member of our group was paired with one to three children, and the game quickly became a highlight of the day.

The visit revealed new ways to serve the orphanage in the future. We discovered a room full of broken bicycles, and our next trip will focus on repairing them, along with other activities like taking computers apart and hosting a birthday party for the children.

Since returning, we received a message from the orphanage director, who shared that the donation of infant diapers was a "Godsend," a reminder of the impact we can have.
