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1.	What is it about Peter that compelled Him to write this letter (hint: 2 Peter 1:12)? Why is this compulsion good news for YOU as a Christian today?
2.	What is the importance of "being found diligent" in verse 14? What does that imply about being found by Him when He returns? How should this drive our Christian daily living?
3.	In verse 16, Peter expresses that some things that Paul wrote are hard to understand. Does this mean we can't know them? Does this mean we should assume we DO know them? What is the implication for our personal and corporate study of the Word?
4.	Based on verse 17, what is one of Peter's MAIN purposes of writing 2 Peter? Do you actively pursue living in the truth with this much voracity?
5.	With the command in verse 18 to always be growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus, how will you practically seek to obey and implement this command in your own spiritual growth?
