THE CONTINUING CASE OF THE INCOMPARABLE CHRIST: HEBREWS 1:8-14

November 15-16, 2025

Main Point: The continuing testimony that Jesus is superior to the angels establishes a foundation in the book of Hebrews, demonstrating that His greatness permeates everything the Old Testament points to and promises.

Three Statements from the Father on the Superiority of the Son

3. Christ the	has no	(13-14)

1.	What have we learned so far in Hebrews 1:1-8? What has impacted you most from the book of Hebrews so far?
2.	How can you make the case that Hebrews 1:8-9 (cf. Psalm 45:6-7) is the most definitive statement on the deity of Jesus in the New Testament? How is Christ's rule described in these verses? How should Christ's rule impact your daily life?
3.	In verses 10-12, what stands out most to you in the author of Hebrews' description of Jesus? In this description of Jesus, what is He being compared and contrasted to? How do these verses provide us with hope and encouragement?
4.	How is Jesus obviously greater than the angels according to verses 13 and 14? Why is it important that Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father (see also Matthew; Mark 14:61-62, 16:19; Romans 8:34; Ephesians 1:19-20; Colossians 3:1; Heb. 8:1, 10:12, 12:2)? What does verse 13 hint at in Christ's second coming (see also Philippians 2:9-11; Revelation 19:11-16)?
5.	As the author of Hebrews paints this verbal picture of the unsurpassing greatness of Jesus in this passage, what should be our response?
