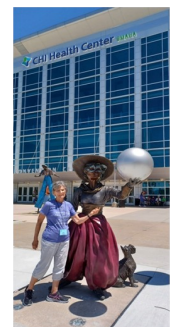
## Voters Meeting

## LWML Mite Walk

I want to thank you all for your generosity in donating to the 2025 Mite Walk at the LWML Convention. If you go to [Home - Lutheran Women's Missionary League](#) and click on Convention Central, you'll be able to scroll down to the Heartland Herald newspaper's Sunday edition to see photos of the walk and some statistics from the convention. There were over 1627 women, men and children participating, and even a dog! \$73,610.04 is the preliminary total on the donations. We wore yellow t-shirts, and there was a stream of yellow as far as you could see over the pedestrian bridge between Nebraska and Iowa. Yes, I made it all the way to Iowa and back to Nebraska in the 96-degree weather! We were grateful for the strong breeze! We heard inspiring bible studies, witnesses of how the LWML has benefitted previous mission organizations, and heard inspiring speakers, not to mention the loving fellowship of sisters from around the country. There were so many us LWMLers walking the sidewalks, we greeted each other with a smile and a "where are you from?"

## What I learned about LCEF:

While I was at the LWML Convention I learned that LCEF (Lutheran Church Extension Fund) has Young Investors Steward Accounts for children age 7 and older. They may receive extra dollars toward their account by earning good grades and/or completing 10+ community service hours each year. At age 16, they can explore the freedom of a debit card and online account access (with custodian approval). Plus, high school seniors with a Y.I. Steward Account can apply for LCEF's annual college scholarship each February. Check it out at: [www.lcef.org/YI](http://www.lcef.org/YI). Adult LCEF investors can direct earned interest to a church or other organization. A Roth IRA can be rolled into a Stewardship Account if you wanted to boost education funds for a special child.

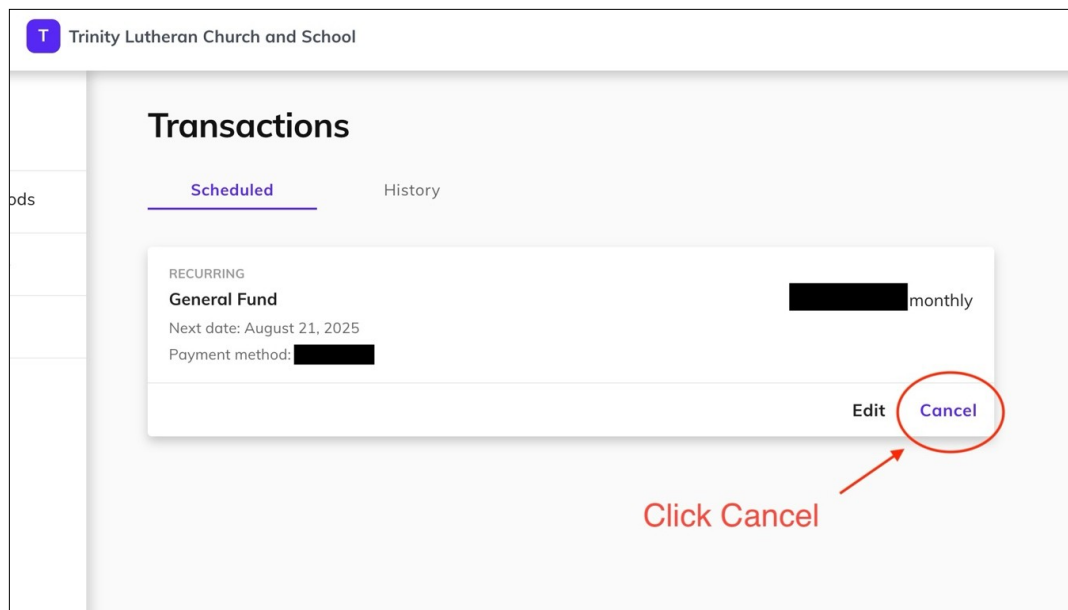
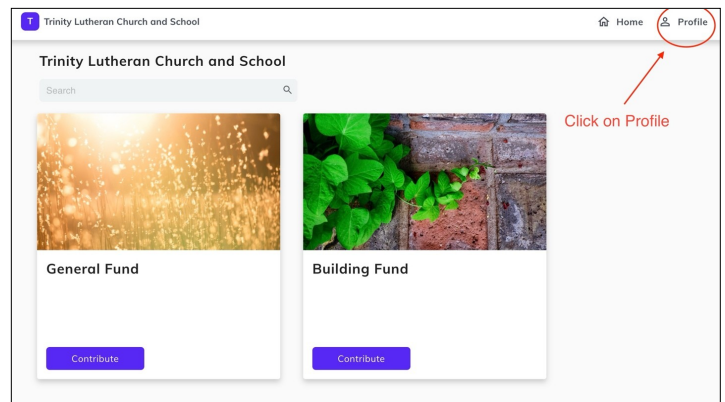
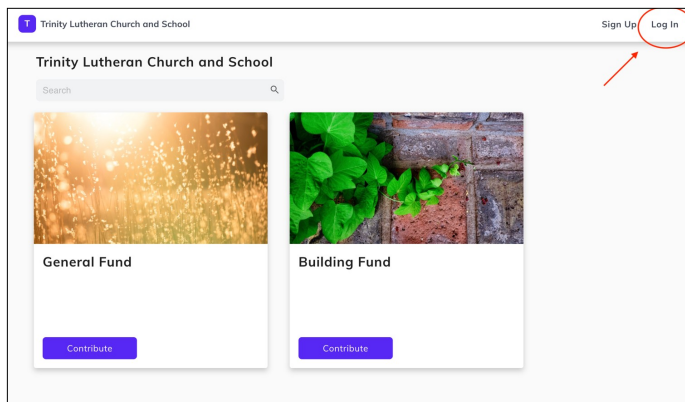

## YOUTH SCOOP

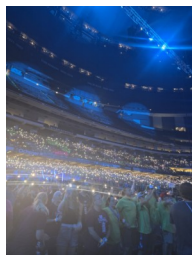
### August Youth Family Night Potluck Wednesday, August 20 @ 5:30pm-8:30pm

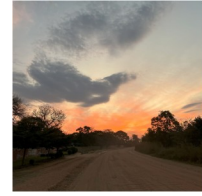

## Hope Willert's Mission Work in Zambia May 2025 Update



Hello friends and family!

I hope you are all doing well - and happy summer! I know for most of you, especially my friends in the northern part of the states, it is such a relief to be able to walk outside in shorts and a t-shirt and not be freezing cold. Here in Zambia, we are feeling the opposite - cold!! June is the coldest month of the year in Zambia, with temperatures at night reaching the mid-40s and temperatures during the day typically hovering in the mid-60s. I know this might not seem cold to many of you, but for those of us in Zambia who are used to 80s and 90s, this is a struggle! There were even a few days when we were so cold in school that we brought in a bunch of blankets for us bundle up in to keep warm while the kids were working (as you can see in the third picture below).

As I have mentioned before, at our school we work to help students learn skills that they will need in their everyday life, not just academic skills. As you can see in the first picture below, our kids are practicing setting the table. This particular day was exciting because this student tends to struggle with being regulated and concentrating on one task until it is completed, and this day he calmly went and set the whole table all by himself without any prompting. It is so exciting when we get to see students making progress like this!

Then in the second picture below, you can see myself with two other women, Jessa (the taller one) and Josephine (the shorter one). These are the two ladies that I work with in the Lower Primary classroom every day, and I love them so much! Jessa is the lead teacher (as well as one of my house-mates) and Josephine is another teacher's assistant, like me. I just wanted to share a picture of these amazing ladies with you all!



This past month I also had the exciting opportunity to participate in a ministry opportunity that I hadn't had the chance to participate in before, which was working on one of our justice projects. Our justice projects are projects that Poetice works on in the community such as drilling new bore holes (a type of well) and putting up solar lights. I was able to go out into the community and help dig some trenches for water pipes as well as a large whole that will be the base for a water tower. This was SO MUCH FUN because I have such a deep love for being in the community. The people are just the kindest and I also like hanging out and playing with the many kids there - some of my school kids even came by to see me! Doing work like this in the community is so powerful because it is a way for us to put our faith into action - to show the people the love of Christ that we have been telling them about. As we can see in the Gospels, Christ not only cared about the spiritual state of His people, but also for the physical state that they were in, so, in doing work like this in the community, we are ministering in a way that Jesus also ministered.

Here are a few random life updates for you all : )

1. At Poetice we have our large church service every Thursday evening, so on Sunday mornings we have House Church, which is similar to what we would think of in America as small group. This past month we had a nshima night with my house church (this is a typical dish eaten in Zambia) and here is a picture of us! I know I have hardly talked about my house church in my updates, so I thought I would share a picture of us. I love these people!
2. Here is a pic of Jess (in the middle), Jessa (on the right), and myself this past month. These are the two girls that I live with and I am so thankful for them!
3. I have really been missing American food, so I baked myself an apple pie (with our family's traditional crust recipe) and YUMMMM - it tasted like home. : )
4. I'm getting a car!!! I received a significant donation which allowed me to be able to afford a car. This is a huge blessing, as it will not only be a benefit to myself but also will allow me to help others. I will be able to help transport people around Choma who do not have vehicles as well as pick up and drop off people from the airport in Livingstone, which is a frequent need at Poetice as we have lots of people coming from the states on missions trips. I am so excited about this and so extremely blessed that God has provided in this way!



### Prayer Requests

In September, Poetice is running a program called Missions 8 where we are sending all of our staff out to the eight countries that border Zambia (plus South Africa - so it is technically Missions 9). This is so exciting!!! The staff has been split into teams, each of which will travel to one or two countries and do ministry there. I am on a team with the other teachers in the school and we will be traveling to Botswana and South Africa, which you can see in the map here. We are still ironing out what we will be doing in Botswana, but we know that we will be visiting a few schools in South Africa. This is an amazing opportunity to share God's love and create connections not only in Zambia, but around Africa! I am always so excited when I get to interact with the body of Christ in other nations.



With that being said, I am looking to fundraise about \$2,500 to support the costs of my travel, lodging, and food during this time. I am asking for prayer as I am working on raising this money, as well as support from all of you. 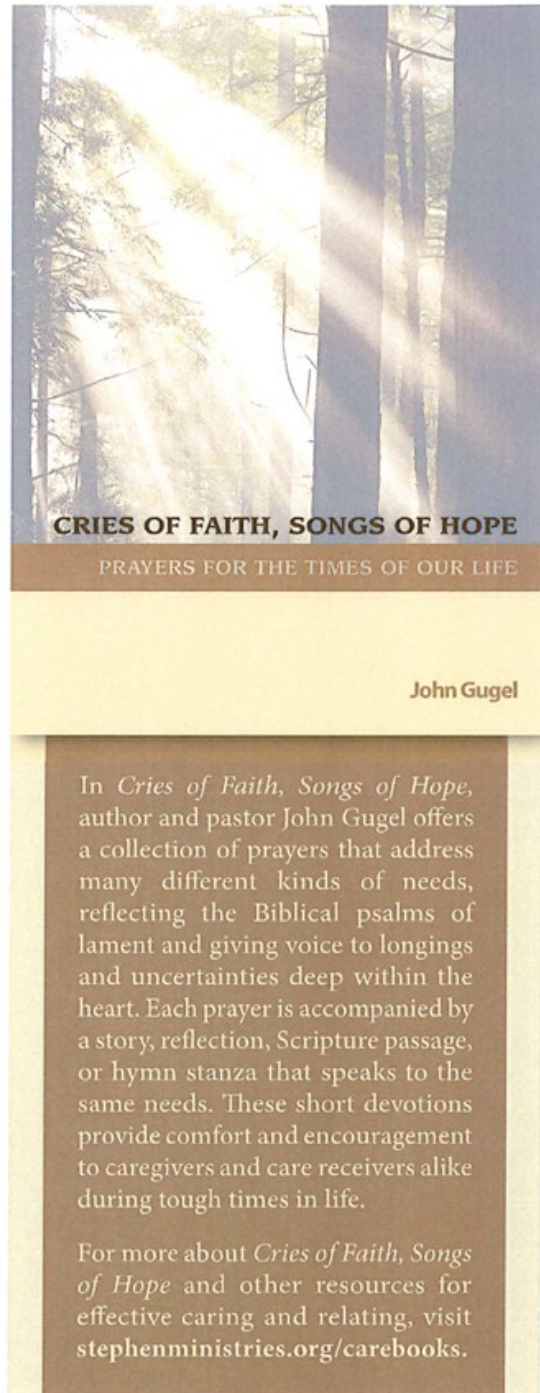
#### **READING**
