"What is Discipleship?"

To ask, "What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus?" is to inquire into the heart of the Christian faith. The word "disciple" comes from the Latin *discipulus*, meaning "student" or "learner". Yet, the biblical vision of discipleship is far more than intellectual learning. It is a call to transformation, a summons to follow, to imitate, and to embody the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Each week we will consider another facet of our identity as modern-day disciples of Jesus according to the Gospel of Luke.

In the Gospels, Jesus calls people with a simple yet profound invitation: "Follow me." Fishermen leave their nets, tax collectors their booths, and many others set aside the ordinary rhythms of their lives to walk in the footsteps of Jesus. This call is not limited to a particular time or place; it echoes through the generations, extending even to us. But at the same time that discipleship can be costly. Discipleship involves placing Jesus at the center of one's life, allowing His words and actions to shape our priorities, choices and values. Discipleship is not an abstract concept but a lived reality, a dynamic process: a continual becoming, day by day, more like Jesus.

A disciple is, at their core, a learner. Jesus' invitation to follow Him is also an invitation to learn from Him. In the ancient world, a disciple would attach themselves to a rabbi, not only to absorb their teachings but to observe how they lived, responded, and engaged with the world. He draws His disciples into a life of radical love, humility, and service. To be a disciple today is to immerse oneself in the Gospels, to listen attentively to Jesus' voice, and to let His teachings become the lens through which we see ourselves and our neighbors

While discipleship involves cost and sacrifice, it is also a path to deep joy and fulfillment. Jesus promises abundant life—life marked by peace, hope, and purpose. To walk with Jesus is to discover the riches of God's kingdom, to experience the transforming power of love, and to participate in God's redemptive work in the world.

Discipleship is not reserved for the spiritual elite; it is the invitation to all who would hear and respond to Jesus' call. It is a journey open to the young and old, the strong and weak, the doubter and the devout.

Join us for our discipleship journey this fall!

Hope Willert's Mission Work in Zambia July 2025 Update



Hello, friends and family!

Greetings from Poetice in Choma, Zambia!

Surprise! Katie Willert (Hope's mom) is writing her newsletter this month. :) Mark and I are over a week into our two-week visit here in Zambia, so I asked Hope to let me share what's happening at Poetice and in her life—from our perspective.

My Top Fifteen Thoughts:

- 1. God is at work here!
 - The people are hungry for and receptive to the Gospel. The staff at Poetice are meeting spiritual, physical, and emotional needs in the community.
- 2. We worked with the school students for several days.
 - I led some STEM projects, and Mark played guitar and sang with them. It was a wonderful experience. The students were excited to share what they've been learning and to try new things. The school uses a Montessori approach, which was fascinating to observe. Jesus' love shines through everything—daily prayer, songs, memory verses, and a great deal of patience! The kids thrive on physical affection, so there's lots of snuggling and hugging throughout the day.

(Fun note: My mom knitted hats for each student, and they were thrilled! We saw them proudly wearing their hats for days afterward.)







- 3. Worship here is incredible.
 - Zambians love to sing and dance! There are no chairs in the worship space because they need room for movement. It was a joy to join them for daily "Prayer Set" and weekly "Worship Night" on Thursdays—both open to the community. The school children join in for Prayer Set, and it's beautiful to see them worship. It reminded us of Chapel at Trinity. Many return for Worship Night, and the first thing they do is run to find their teachers for a hug.
- 4. Prayer is central at Poetice.
 - Prayer happens in many forms: group prayer, partner prayer, individual prayer, laying on of hands, silent prayer, and everyone praying aloud at once. It's moving to be part of a community so deeply connected to Jesus through constant prayer.

5. Hope's House Church is thriving.

She meets weekly with a group of 6–7 people. It's similar to a small group—they read Scripture, discuss, sing, pray, and share a meal. We were there on her birthday, and they spoke words of life over her, laid hands on her, and prayed. It was so special to be part of that.

6. We feel immense peace as parents.

God has clearly placed Hope in a community that loves her like family. They watch out for her, encourage her, and keep her grounded in the Word. Whether at the grocery store or walking through town, people know her and call out greetings. It's clear she's making an impact.



7. Poetice meets practical needs.

Hope just started "Term Break." The school calendar here is different—they have breaks in August, December, and April, but no long summer like in the U.S. During school, Poetice provides nutritious snacks and lunches, but many school families still need that during Break, so teachers buy and deliver food to families in need. It's beautiful ministry.



8. They also meet water needs.

Poetice drills and improves wells in the community. Hope has shared before about the drought, but I'm happy to report that things seem to be improving. We're seeing green gardens and functioning water sources. Community outreach is one of Hope's favorite aspects of her work.

9. Mark participated in Prison Ministry.

He joined a team from Poetice visiting the local prison to share the Gospel. Hope occasionally goes too. What a powerful way to bring hope to the overlooked.

10. They do regular evangelism.

Groups from Poetice go out into the community weekly to share Jesus. Mark loved being part of that!

11. Youth are everywhere!

Poetice's Youth House program, which Hope helps lead, hosts games, worship, and Bible lessons. It's one of her favorite ministries. The "Rec Park" is also open most days for older youth to play sports, and it always ends with a Gospel message. Mark even shared the message at one session—and also ministered to the younger kids watching from outside the fence.



12. The school is growing!

(Did I mention there are a lot of youth?) Like Trinity, the current school is short on space. Poetice plans to build a PreK-12th grade school to serve up to 500 students. Please pray for this expansion. I had a wonderful time praying and sharing stories with the school principal.



13. The staff work so hard!

We're staying with Hope and her two American missionary roommates. They're rarely home—between teaching, worship team, youth ministry, and more. Everyone at Poetice serves with such love and dedication. It's inspiring.

14. We met Hope's boyfriend, Charles.

He's the Technology Coordinator at Poetice, and a truly wonderful young man. The school principal summed it up best: "Charles is so kind, polite, and a true gentleman. He clearly loves Jesus—and Hope, in that order. The kids adore him. He works hard and does whatever is asked. We all love him." After spending time with him, we agree 100%. Watching them together was a definite highlight of the trip.

15. Hope's car is a blessing!

It allows her to get to work, yes, but she also uses it for ministry: taking teachers to buy baby supplies, delivering food, transporting prison ministry teams, and more. That car has been packed full of God's love in action.







- ... after the relationship falls apart and the bottom falls out of your life.
- ... after the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."
- ... after the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."
- ... after the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away—and the house suddenly seems empty.
- ... after the gavel comes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
 - ... after the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
 - ... after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
 - ... after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the After People. They are ready to come alongside you—or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives—and provide comfort and support for as long after as needed.
