From Your Interim Pastor

How might MVBC successfully fund a 2026 ministry budget of \$916,385? The short answer is: By increasing giving by around ten percent.

A ten percent increase sounds large, doesn't it? When we look more closely, the challenge becomes less daunting. Consider the following examples, which are based on once-a-month giving.

If I give a monthly gift of \$10, a ten percent increase comes to \$1 per month or \$12 per year. That's close to the cost of a fast food meal.

If I give a monthly gift of \$50, a ten percent increase comes to \$5 more per month or \$60 per year. That's less expensive than two rounds of golf at many local golf courses.

If I give a monthly gift of \$100, a ten percent increase comes to \$10 more per month, or \$120 per year. That's roughly the cost for one adult ticket to Dollywood plus the cost of parking.

If I give a monthly gift of \$300, a ten percent increase comes to \$30 more per month, or \$360 per year. That's roughly the cost of a non-premium season ticket for Lady Vols basketball games.

When we take this approach, we may discover that increasing our giving by ten percent is feasible. I encourage you to pray, reflect, and act on the possibility.
