IN EVERYTHING GIVE THANKS - Pastor Jim Brown

My current 3-message series is on THANKSGIVING as I feel we could always use a refresher on being THANKFUL to our Lord God.

I love the "NINE WORDS" we say often in church: "REJOICE ALWAYS, PRAY WITHOUT CEASING, IN



EVERYTHING GIVE THANKS; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18. (I love those verses – and IF I were ever visiting another church and for some reason asked to preach a sermon impromptu, no Bible, no notes, that's one of a short list of passages I'd go to!)

Think about this: those nine words ARE God's will for you and me since we are in Christ Jesus, aka Born Again. They are NOT optional. SOME THOUGHTS FROM THE BOARD CHAIRMAN – Art Pedersen

In the Bible, November has several significant things happening. This part of the year in the Hebrew calendar is covered by the months of Kislev, early November, and Cheshvan, the latter part and into December.

Deuteronomy 1:3 says that "In the fortieth year, on the first day of the eleventh month, Moses proclaimed to the



Israelites all that he Lord had commanded him concerning them." Then in verse 8, after God had shown Moses all the lands they were promised, "See, I have given you this land. Go in and take possession of the land the Lord swore he would give to your fathers – Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob – and to their descendants after them." So, it was this time of year that God commanded the Israelites to take the "promise land." Today they are still struggling to keep it.

It was this time of year that the waters of the great flood started to recede, bringing hope and a sign of God's provision for Noah and his family. And Zechariah records that the word of the Lord came to him on the 24th day of the eleventh month. This message provided reassurance and a vision for the restoration of Israel during a difficult time for the returning exiles.

This is also the time the first Temple, constructed by Solomon, was finally dedicated.

According to what I have read on Biblical Timeline, some modern spiritual teachings associate November with spiritual themes based on the Jewish calendar and scriptural reflections. It is a time for believers to focus on inner battles and the importance of right actions, and to focus on this month as a time for spiritual protection. Some interpret this month, derived from prophetic teaching, as a time to experience the great flow of God's presence, symbolized by a "river of Holy Spirit" which brings peace, healing, and rest.

I don't know if they realized it, but the Pilgrims picked a good time to celebrate Thanksgiving. A "river of Holy Spirit" bringing us nothing but good things is something to celebrate and be extremely grateful for. God's blessings flow freely and with no limits.

ANSWERS TO BIG QUESTIONS – Geoff Glossop, Apologetics and Bible Teacher

HOW DO I BECOME A CHRISTIAN?

God invites everyone to become a Christian. (2 Peter 3:9, Acts 17:30) While the specific way to accept this invitation is not described in concise detail, the Bible does provide strong guidelines.

The Bible verse John 3:16 reads, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." The word "believes" here is the Greek word Pisteuō, which means much more than just "believe", as in "knowledge of." It means to trust in, rely on, obey, and put total confidence in.

In other words, there isn't a list of specific physical actions that will deliver the status of being a Christian; it is more about your state of mind (and heart) with respect to Jesus. Anyone who is sincerely and honestly seeking to know God will find Him, as in Jeremiah 29:13, "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart."

Individual experiences of becoming a Christian vary considerably, but here are some common aspects:

- Recognize your sin: acknowledge that sin separates you from God
- Repent and ask forgiveness: turn away from sin
- Believe in Jesus Christ and acknowledge that He is God: have faith in Jesus and His ultimate sacrifice as atonement for the sins of mankind (including you)
- Invite Jesus into your life: receive Jesus as your Lord and Savior and surrender your life to His leadership
- Receive the Holy Spirit: the indwelling Spirit brings about a spiritual rebirth, with a new,
 God-centered personality
- Live as a follower of God: be confident in speaking about and acting according to your newfound truth
- Grow to love God: as you get to know Him better, you will love Him more
- Desire obedience to God: when you acknowledge His Deity, when you understand more
 of who He is and what He has done for you, you will desire above all to be obedient to
 Him

Following some or all of the above, a person will begin to see God differently. 1 Corinthians 12:3 tells us, "no one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit." Romans 10:9 makes a similar statement, "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." In both cases, Paul is referring to sincere, honest confessions of personal belief.

A true Christian desires and pursues a relationship with God that is grounded in an attitude of trust and in obedience rooted in love, ultimately leading to a transformed lifestyle in which

love and obedience to God, combined with service to others, become absolute priorities. It is the most wonderful experience you can possibly imagine. **Next:** What Will Heaven Be Like?
