

Sermon Notes: 4.2.23 "How Do You Spell Success?"

We have been on a journey with the Lord through Lent, and we have now reached Palm Sunday. This seems like such an exciting scene, as we read Matthew's account of it. It is the Passover, and so there are probably about 2 million people in and around Jerusalem. Jesus, for the first time in his ministry, has actually planned a very public demonstration. Up to this time, he had warned people NOT to tell who he was, and had deliberately avoided "public" scenes.

Palm Sunday is different, though. For one thing, Jesus is fulfilling the prophecy recorded in Zechariah 9:9 - a prophecy that could only apply to the Christ. Jesus was the one who was announcing that he was Israel's king, by riding in on a donkey. A donkey? Yes! Donkeys were the royal animal of Jewish monarchs (1 Kings 2:32). If a king came into town riding a donkey, they were coming in peace. If the king came into town riding a war horse...well....

This is the scene as Matthew describes it:

1When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, 2saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. 3If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately. " 4This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, 5"Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey." 6The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; 7they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. 8A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. 9The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" 10When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" 11The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee." (Matt. 21: 1-11 NRSV)

Fame...power...influence... Does that spell success? Does this mean that Palm Sunday was a "success?" And was Jesus as excited as the crowds that day about his successful public declaration of Kingship? Actually, we read in Luke 19:41, "And when he drew near and saw the city, he wept over it." Maybe we need to take a closer look at how we spell success.





This is what I think about when I think of Gadsden First United Methodist Church. I think about singing praise to God for God's awesome works that are done through this church. I think about singing anthems to God's beautiful name. Easter draws a

hallelujah from my heart like no other time of the year!

Each year GFUMC has received an "Alleluia Offering" at Easter time because of hearts overflowing with praise and thanksgiving. An Alleluia Offering is over and above our regular giving and is always used for something special. For instance, a couple of years ago, our Alleluia Offering was used to create our new Children's Worship Space in memory of Joanne Hightower. Last year, we used 60% of the offering for our worship music, and 40% for Inviting Ministries and to enhance our online outreach. The goal was to grow our church family, and to make the worship experience something to remember.

This year, we plan to use 50% of our Alleluia Offering for our worship music again, and the other 50% for enhanced security and capital improvements. I don't need to explain about the music - you all know how awesome our music is, and we want it to remain that way. But let me say a word about security and capital improvements. We need to update our security cameras, and to be able to hire security for special events. We want our members and guests to feel safe and secure when they come to an event at GFUMC! Capital improvements would include things like replacing and updating the thermostats for our twenty-four HVAC Units. as well as starting the process of replacing our lighting with more efficient LED bulbs. (All of this will provide savings in the long run!)

Last year, we had the biggest Alleluia Offering our church has seen in a long time! Thank you so much! With your generosity, we hope that gifts to our Alleluia Offering will exceed \$35,000 again this year. You can help us reach that goal by giving at least 10% (or more) of your weekly income as a special offering. Pray about it, and then present your offering any Sunday during the month of April. We will announce the total each week, and then celebrate the grand total for our 2023 Alleluia Offering on Mothers' Day.
