Sermon Notes: Thursday, November 30 and Sunday December 3

Advent begins on Sunday. This is a season of preparation and waiting. We remember that as the Israelites waited for the birth of the Messiah, we await the Messiah's return. We also remember that as Mary waited for Jesus to be born, so we await Jesus to be born again in our hearts at Christmas. Advent can be known as the season of anticipation, so we anticipate the coming festivities of Christmas and the weeks ahead. How are you preparing to keep a Holy Advent? Let me offer a few suggestions for personal devotion and spiritual growth.

- 1.Read a chapter of Luke each day before Christmas in December. You will finish the gospel on Christmas Eve.
- 2. Invest in or create an Advent Calendar. With the countdown of each day, pray a specific prayer for the season or pray for a different person each day
- 3. Create your own Advent wreath. An Advent liturgy for lighting can be found online or in the Upper Room Devotional, which can be picked up at the church.
- 4. Attend worship on November 30 or December 3 and learn more about the symbolism of the season.

Thursday Night Worship and Traditions worship will include a *Celebration of the Chrismons* and Celebrations worship will include the *Hanging of the Green*. However you mark this special season, I pray that you experience the fullness of God's love.





During the month of October, we journeyed through Generosity: New Beginnings. In this emphasis you were invited to consider how God is calling you to a new beginning and how you are committing to a new beginning. Through the spiritual disciplines of prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness God transforms us and makes us new. God may have called you to a new prayer emphasis, or a renewed commitment to worship. The Lord might have invited you to tithe or a new avenue of service. God could have nudged you to invite someone to church or share your faith in another way. I am excited to hear about all the new beginning at First United Methodist Church of Gadsden.

If you have not made a commitment to your new beginning and completed your estimate of giving card, I encourage you to do so. Fifty-three giving units within the church have done so already. Your card may be turned into the church office, in the offering plate, or electronically on the church website/app. If you have lost your card, blank estimate of giving cards are available at the information table in the Chestnut Street lobby. Please turn your card in as soon as possible, this helps the leadership plan for 2024 and to be good stewards of resources. Remember that your estimate is just an estimate, and not a binding contract. The information is kept confidential with the financial secretary. In addition to the logistical aspect of stewardship, this year's card includes a space for you to indicate and commit to how God might be calling you to step up in 2024.

Did You Know?

Many Christmas traditions have been handed down to us from the Middle Ages, when the holiday of Christmas became more important than it had ever been. It was during the Middle Ages that St. Francis of Assisi came up with the idea of the Nativity scene, using animals and villagers to re-enact the story of Jesus' birth at Bethlehem, which were eventually replaced by the ceramic, plaster, and plastic figures that we know today.

The evergreen ball comes to us from that time, too. During the Middle Ages, villagers would wind together twine and evergreen branches into a ramshackle ball shape. In the center of this conglomeration of evergreen boughs, they would place a figure of an infant to represent the baby Jesus. These "holy boughs", as they were called, would be hung from passageways and big houses to render blessings and good luck to all who passed under the bough and the Holy Infant.
