Remembering our identity in Christ is a great way to go into the new year! We started last week by remembering our baptism. We remembered that we are marked in baptism by God's love, initiated into God's family, and grafted into the church, the body of Christ. All of that means that we can no longer keep our hearts set on the things that are of the world. That's not who we are. Instead, we set our hearts on that which nourishes life.

In order to do that, there are some things that have to go. In addition, there are some things that we yearn for. It's a dynamic of holding on and letting go...not just doing, but *being* God's own people. This is how it is described in 1 Peter 2: 1-10...

Therefore, get rid of all ill will and all deceit, pretense, envy, and slander. ² Instead, like a newborn baby, desire the pure milk of the word. Nourished by it, you will grow into salvation, 3 since you have tasted that the Lord is good. 4 Now you are coming to him as to a living stone. Even though this stone was rejected by humans, from God's perspective it is chosen, valuable. 5 You yourselves are being built like living stones into a spiritual temple. You are being made into a holy priesthood to offer up spiritual sacrifices that are acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 6 Thus it is written in scripture, Look! I am laying a cornerstone in Zion, chosen, valuable. The person who believes in him will never be shamed. ⁷ So God honors you who believe. For those who refuse to believe, though, the stone the builders tossed aside has become the capstone.8 This is a stone that makes people stumble and a rock that makes them fall. Because they refuse to believe in the word, they stumble. Indeed, this is the end to which they were appointed. 9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people who are God's own possession. You have become this people so that you may speak of the wonderful acts of the one who called you out of darkness into his amazing light. 10 Once you weren't a people, but now you are God's people. Once you hadn't received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Join us this Sunday as we remember who we are: we are disciples who still need to grow; we are living stones built into a spiritual house; we are priests who serve as a bridge from darkness to light. If we know who we are, we'll know what to do.

Warehouse in Decatur! This year, we will be collecting donations of items for the buckets so that those can then be divided up and packed! You can help by donating multiple quantities of the same item or by sponsoring a tornado bucket. The estimated cost of the items for one tornado bucket is \$120. We hope to have lots of buckets ready to take to our Disaster Relief Warehouse at the end of February.

Specific Items Needed to Complete a Tornado Bucket

- 1 Standard Size Claw Hammer
- 1 Shirt Pocket Notebook, 1 Permanent Marker.
- 1 Pencil and Sharpener in a Ziploc Bag
- 12 Black 30-45 Gallon Trash Bags
- 1 Roll of Toilet Paper in Zip Lock bag

Work Gloves-Leather Palm or All Leather Gloves

- 50 Count #8 Nails
- 10 White 13 Gallon Trash Bags with drawstrings.
- 1 Cellophane Packing Tape
- 10 One Gallon Zip Lock Bags
- 1 Box Cutter
- 1 Hand Sanitizer (4oz to 12 oz)
- 1 Insect Repellant Spray or Can, or Wipes or combination
- 1 pair Safety Glasses
- 6 Clear 40 -55 Gallon Trash Bags
- 3 Tampons or Pads in a Zip Loc Bag

Guidelines for End of Year Contributions

In order for contributions to be posted to your 2022 giving record, they must meet one of these requirements:

- 1. The gift is received and posted to your account before December 31st.
- 2. The contribution is put into the offering plate or delivered to the office on or before December 29th.
- 3. The envelope in which the gift is mailed is postmarked on or before December 31st.
- 4. An online E-Giving transaction is dated on or before December 30th. (Find link at fumcgadsden.org/giving)
- 5. Gifts of stock should be transferred before the market closes on December 30th. Please inform the financial Office at the church about a stock transfer.
