
### **RENOVATE:** Building a Life With God






# **Entering the Passion of Jesus**


A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week by Amy-Jill Levine

# What is R.A.M.?

**Remote Area Medical** is a major nonprofit provider of free mobile clinics. Their mission is to prevent pain and alleviate suffering by providing free, quality healthcare to those in need. They do this by delivering free *dental*, *vision*, and *medical* services to underserved and uninsured individuals. RAM will open their clinic for two days at Gadsden City High School on Saturday, March 28 and Sunday, March 29. Ticket distribution usually begins at 3 am and patients are served in numerical order according to their ticket when clinic doors open at 6 am. Due to time constraints, patients must choose between dental and vision services. Medical services are offered to every patient attending the clinic. The event is free and open to the public.
