#### Sunday, May 29 Rev. Keith Elder

Singer, songwriter, retreat leader--Keith Elder has spoken and performed for thirty-plus years in a wide variety of church, conference, and community settings. While serving local churches in North Alabama, first as a youth director then as a pastor, Keith continued to write and record, play small concert venues, and provide leadership for special events. As of July, 2020, he is officially retired from pastoral ministry, which makes him even more available



to sing and speak for local churches and special events.

Keith has recorded seven full album projects, with his latest, "Mine that Mountain," being released in August, 2014. He has numerous new projects in the works including "Good Life" (due for release, Fall of 2021), and an accoustic Christmas project. Besides many theme songs for camps, service organizations, and special events, he has also written and produced several small-scale musicals.

Keith's songs are life/people songs crossing the lines of Christian, Folk/ Americana, Musical Theater, and contemporary Bluegrass. When asked about his genre, he likes to say that he just writes what comes out on a given day. These days he is shooting for an honest word, a compelling story, and a fitting musical form to carry the message. No doubt, his favorite songwriter quote comes from the legendary Roger Miller: "Songwriting is easy. It's like taking candy...from a bear."

Because the new songs continue to surface, Keith's concerts and Sunday morning messages-in-song are ever-evolving, but all include songs that ring true, stories that draw the listener in, and food for thought works on people long after Keith has left the building. If you hear echoes of James Taylor, John Denver, or Larry Gatlin, you won't be the first.

Keith and his wife Jean have been married 42 years and currently reside in Vestavia Hills, Alabama.







Find out more...Since the 1990s, following the collapse of the Soviet Union and the 1986 Chernobyl disaster, the North Alabama Conference has reached out in love to our brothers and sisters in Eastern Europe as they have sought to restore physical health and to reclaim and rebuild Christian communities and houses of worship. This wave of care from a groundswell of churches in the North Alabama Conference changed many lives.

Over the years, the North Alabama Conference has partnered with United Methodists in the Baltics in numerous ways. We have supported two missionary families (Patrick and Hannah Friday and Dale and Kelly Clem), hosted 250 children (the Children of Chernobyl) from Belarus who spent summer weeks in North Alabama homes and churches, provided support for seminary students to lead new churches, sent numerous mission teams and funding, collected coats and supplies, sponsored pilgrims on Emmaus walks, established Baltic Chrysalis, welcomed young people as delegates to Sumatanga's International Peace Camp and built Camp Wesley for Latvians and Lithuanians to have their own "Sumatanga".


Millions of Ukrainians have fled their homeland and are in need of care. Each family has unique needs, and our United Methodist friends are trying to respond to their new neighbors with limited resources. Our fellow United Methodists are providing direct relief to refugees whose physical and spiritual needs are great. For example, in Lithuania, a church set up one family in a church-owned parsonage and spent \$860 to help the family to settle in. Churches are also inviting their guests to come to worship, and some refugees are actively sharing their musical gifts and presence in worship.
