

Thursday, October 12 & Sunday, October 15 Sermon Notes "Our Witness"

This week marks the middle of Generosity: New Beginnings. The prayer question for this week is "How is your ministry a witness for what God can do?" and the scripture is Isaiah 43:8-13. I encourage you to study and read Isaiah 43 as we work through this sermon series. I believe this additional time of study will enrich your experience as we move through the series. In the scripture reading, the prophet shares that God's children were once blind and deaf to the works of God. They will know that their false gods were ineffective, and God will deliver them. They will be able to see God's mighty acts of salvation and they will be witnesses to the power of God.

The passage for this week, challenges us to consider how we might be "witnesses" for God. Like it or not, as Christians, all that we do is a witness of God. The question is, "Is this a positive or a negative witness?" How we honor God and the church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness is our witness. Do our actions and words tell the world of God's might saving grace and the Good News of Jesus Christ?



First United Methodist Church of Gadsden During the month of October we will be offering training for First UMC Gadsden's Safe Sanctuaries Policy. Everyone in our church should be concerned about Safe Sanctuaries and anyone is welcomed to attend this important training on Sunday, Oct. 8 @ 12 noon and another date TBA.

What is Safe Sanctuaries? The Safe Sanctuary Policy puts in place rules and guidelines for our church family as a whole and the church staff

and volunteers for ministry with children, youth and vulnerable adults. This policy is important because it protects our children and youth under the age of 19 and vulnerable adults! While the policy has a lot of specifics for various aspects of nursery care, Children's Ministry and Youth Activities, it is important to remember these three rules for all church activities, events, practices, and meetings of any kind: 1) There must be two unrelated adults present. 2) Volunteers in ministry with these groups must be active in the church for at least 6 months before taking a leadership role. 3) Volunteers in leadership roles must be at least 5 years older than the age group that they are working with. Thank you for helping us keep our most precious gifts safe!




LIBBY, ROB, & RACHEL REYNOLDS


